



Dear friends in Christ:

At our recent Lutheran Church–Canada convention, the delegates voted to restructure the synod, accepting changes to the church’s statutory bylaws, constitution, and synodical bylaws.

One very important part of our constitution (and this is true for our congregation, too) is Article II, our Confession. The new constitution reads, “Lutheran Church–Canada, and every Member must accept, without reservation:

1. the Scriptures of the Old and the New Testament as the written Word of God and the only rule and norm of faith and of practice;
2. all the Symbolical Books of the Evangelical Lutheran Church as a true and unadulterated statement and exposition of the Word of God, to wit: the three Ecumenical Creeds (the Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, the Athanasian Creed), the Unaltered Augsburg Confession, the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Smalcald Articles, The Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope, the Large Catechism of Luther, the Small Catechism of Luther, and the Formula of Concord.

Note that in this list are the three great jewels that the Church possesses: the Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, and the Athanasian Creed.

To share a bit of background on the creeds: the *Apostles' Creed* had its beginning in the time of the early church. It is a summary of what the apostles wrote in the Bible. It was used by those who were being Baptized in the early Church. It was not written by the apostles themselves, however.

The *Nicene Creed* is named after the city of Nicaea, where the first statement of this creed were written, and accepted by a Church council. Some men had begun to teach false ideas about God and especially about Jesus Christ. Leaders of the Church met to discuss the problem; they agreed on this clear statement of what Christians believe. It is used at part of the liturgy of our Communion services.

The third general creed is the *Athanasian Creed*. It is named after the great Christian teacher, Athanasius. At the time of its writing, there were still some people in the church trying to convince Christians that Jesus isn't

...Continued from page 1 God. They still had not given up. So Christians wrote another clear statement describing Scripture's teaching about the person and work of Jesus. They also made sure it was clear that the Holy Spirit is God.

We sometimes take these glorious statements for granted. If only we were more like the young man in China, who was given a bible by a young seminarian teaching English. The young man read through the New Testament in English in a week, and asked for more to read. He was given a copy of the Apostles' Creed. The young Chinese student read through it quickly, and immediately replied, "This says the same thing as the book you just gave me—only shorter."

The Apostles' Creed has always been very helpful to Christians. It does four things for us. First, it gives us a short way of saying what we believe when we are baptized. Second, it praises God for giving us faith to believe what He teaches about Himself in the Bible. When Christians recite the Creed together, they're celebrating the fact that God has made us one, uniting us in a common faith. Third, it gives us a quick and handy tape measure to see if ideas and beliefs are Christian, so that the people of God don't end up falling for ideas invented by people. And fourth, it gives Christians who know the Creed by memory, a way to remind themselves of all the great things God has done for them. It is a wonderful way to teach our children about the God who created the world; about God the Son, who came to redeem the world through His death and resurrection; and of God the Holy Spirit, who brings faith and life through the Word and the Sacraments God has given to us.

There are many today who say we need Christ, not creeds. The irony of this is that this statement is itself a creed—a statement of what of what they believe. In contrast to this, we remember that the creeds focus on Christ, and God's plan for our salvation. The Creeds are not just words to be spoken. That is a mistake some people make. They are a confession of our faith. To confess our faith through the creed is to make the words our own. When we say the creeds we mean, "this the church believes—and I believe it, too."

In this special year of celebration, when we rejoice in the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, it is so important to remember the faith we confess. How blessed we are to be a confessing church—and to have this glorious hope of the Lord who loves, redeems, and blesses us in His grace!

Immediately he rose and went down the hall of the hospital to her room. Dressed in his doctor's gown he went in to see her. He recognized her at once. He went back to the consultation room determined to do his best to save her life. From that day he gave special attention to the case.

After a long struggle, the battle was won. Dr. Kelly requested the business office to pass the final bill to him for approval. He looked at it, then wrote something on the edge and the bill was sent to her room. She feared to open it, for she was sure it would take the rest of her life to pay for it all. Finally she looked, and something caught her attention on the side of the bill. She read these words.... "Paid in full with one glass of milk"

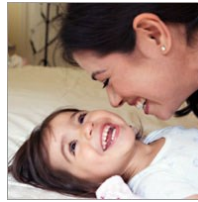

Faith Talk in the Home

"You shall teach them to your children, talking of them when you are sitting in your house, and when you are walking by the way, and when lie down, and when you rise". Deuteronomy 11:19

Faith is built when it is expressed naturally within the context of the family. It is not reserved for Sundays or formal prayer times, which are certainly important, but it becomes part of the fabric of daily life. For example:

- Start a habit of sharing highs and lows of the day with each other, and use them to help formulate prayers.
- Share things that might be ongoing struggles or choices that have to be made. Talk together about how God's Word applies to issues that arise in your lives. Pray together for strength to stand firm on His Word.
- When conflict arises, remind each other that God's forgiveness in Christ enables us to confess our sins to each other and to forgive each other. Use the words "I forgive you" when someone says "I'm sorry".
- Share "God-sightings". Encourage each other to watch for ways that God has been working in your lives and in your family, and share them with each other. You might keep a family journal of "God-sightings" that you can look back on.
- Look for unscripted opportunities for faith talk as your days unfold, for example an event that reminds you of a Bible lesson, or recognition of signs of God's faithful care for His creation and you.

Over the next newsletters, we will have a look at the other "Cornerposts" for building faith. May our Lord Jesus strengthen your faith and your family as you live together in His Word!

A Peek Into Our Preschool

At the end of one VBS morning this summer, one of my former students spoke with me. She was going into grade 5 and had been taking violin lessons for about 3 years. She confidently suggested that she could play for the preschool children sometime during the year. She said she even knew some Christian songs. As I was finalizing my September unit plan, it occurred to me how I might include her suggestion. During the week the classes focused on the letter F for "Farley Fox fiddling with his front feet and fishing with his back feet," I invited this alumna to play for an afternoon group of preschool students so they could see and hear an actual fiddle (i.e. violin). The violin accompanied us as we sang "Happy Birthday" to a child who was celebrating her birthday. We continued with a few other songs. The children, normally very wiggly in September, were totally engaged. As what we had planned was drawing to a close, my former student decided to end with a Bach piece that she had been practicing. The preschool students were blessed by her servant heart. I was so pleased with her presentation and with the preschool students who demonstrated their best manners.

As I talked to my former student's parent a couple weeks later, she shared that she credited her daughter's confidence, in part to her experience in our preschool. She valued that many activities were purposefully structured so that children were able to be independently successful. This is not only advantageous to their educational future, but in other areas of their life.

One of my goals when children leave us to attend kindergarten, is that they feel capable in their next steps. They can go to a new school with new friends and a new teacher knowing that Jesus promises, "I am with you, always." It is one of the Bible verses the children learn each year. We have recently read the Bible account of Jesus blessing the children and even though we are only in our second month, many children expressed confidence in the knowledge that they are loved and valued by Jesus. A depiction of Jesus and the children is on our wall year round to remind us.

Cameroon Mission Trip

On January 13th, 2018 an 8-person team will be traveling from Alberta to Cameroon to undertake two projects. Deaconess Miriam is privileged to be part of that team.

The first project will be to support a 5-day retreat for Lutheran Bible Translators working in West Africa. Missionaries and their families (about 40 people, including children) will meet in Ngaoundéré, Cameroon for a time of spiritual renewal, focusing on the topic of Spiritual Warfare. This is an important opportunity for these missionary families, who are so concerned that others receive the Word in their heart language, to be supported in their own faith, and to receive the Word and worship in their own heart language. It is also a rare opportunity for them to gather together to support each other in their work.

The Alberta team will support the retreat in a variety of ways, including music support for worship, family time programming, and a VBS-type program for the children while parents are in study sessions.

Once the retreat is finished, seven members of the team will travel to Galim, where Pastor Mike Kuhn is working, to help with construction of a library to be connected with the Galim Lutheran School, but also to be available to the community.

Team members are finding ways to cover their own costs for travel to Cameroon. They will also be working to raise funds for these projects over the next several months - \$16,000 to cover the cost of the retreat, and \$20,000 for purchase and transport of materials to Galim, as well as to hire a crew to complete the project.

Our VBS offerings of nearly \$2,000 have already been sent to support the retreat, and we thank the congregation of Foothills Lutheran Church for contributing to these projects through October's Mission of the Month! Watch for other opportunities to help out over the next few months.

We also ask you to pray for the team preparing to travel to Cameroon, including Sid and Melanie Kuhn, Red Deer; Jessie Branson, Markerville; Rhonda Kelman, Parksville, B.C.; Christine Kreutz, Edmonton; President Glenn Schaffer, Edmonton; Sherry LaRose, Red Deer; and Deaconess Miriam Winstanley, Calgary. Mission of the Month



November: Inn from the Cold

The mission of Inn from the Cold is to provide emergency shelter, support and programs to homeless children, their families and others in need, with the goal of building healthy, stable families and ending homelessness. A number of churches, community associations and organizations have come together to provide emergency shelter and resources for Calgary's homeless. These Community Inns continue to operate on a rotating basis, 365 days a year, and are located in communities across Calgary. Inn from the Cold also operates Calgary's first Emergency Family Shelter.


December: Robert Ohlinger Scholarship Fund

The Robert Ohlinger Scholarship Fund was set up to assist Foothills Lutheran members who are studying to go into professional church work. It is administered by the Board of Elders of Foothills Lutheran Church. The fund was initiated by donations in memory of Robert Ohlinger, the oldest son of our Pastor Emeritus, Eldon Ohlinger. Robert was struck and killed by a car in May 1975 at the age of 14 as he was walking home from a school band activity. Robert played clarinet, bass clarinet, piano and guitar. He enjoyed using his musical gifts as one of FLC's musicians for Sunday morning folk services.
