Dear friends in Christ:

Summer is gardening time, but that also means it is time for fresh fruits and vegetables grown close to home.

Nat King Cole sang, "Roll out those lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer; Those days of soda and pretzels and beer; Roll out those lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer! Dust off the sun and moon and sing a song of cheer". That is the way that many people feel when summer rolls around. It's time to sing a song of cheer.

SUMMER OFFICE HOURS: Please make sure to phone the office prior to coming by the church to ensure that someone will be here to let you in. Pastor Bode, Pastor Eric and Deaconess Miriam are out of the office at various times as their work requires (and hopefully will take some well-deserved time off, too).

We are into the season of bright, sunny days. Summer is here! Take some time this summer not just to enjoy the sun, but to consider what it can teach us about our wonderful, loving God.

Take some sunny-day walks, and spend some time talking with your children about the sun.

- Light was created on the first day, but when did God create the sun? Why? Read Genesis 1:14-19 and talk about how God is a God of order. What in this passage tells us this? If you have a *Lutheran Study Bible*, check out the study note for verse 14 and marvel at His planning.
- See how bright you can make a room by opening curtains and letting the sun shine in. Turn on the lights too! Isaiah 60:19 tells us that there will a day when we won't need the sun, because God's radiance will be the only light. Imagine the brightness of the centre of the sun, and then think about how bright God's radiance will be when we see it.

The sun shall be no more your light by day, nor for brightness shall the moon give you light; But the Lord will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory. Isaiah 60:19

- Watch a sunrise and see how the shadows shorten and are chased away by the sun. God's light chases away the shadows of the sun. Psalm 18:28 tells us that God turns darkness into light.
- At night, shine a flashlight on a dark wall. Use your hands to make shadow puppets. Now we have the sun by day and the moon by night. In heaven there will never be a night. Nothing will block God's light. See what Revelation 22:5 has to say about this!

Have a sunny, and Son-filled summer!
