Dear Friends in Christ, and fellow redeemed:

It doesn't take long for the red of Valentine's Day to be replaced with the green of St. Patrick's Day. For one day, everyone seems to have a bit of the Irish in them, celebrating a day dedicated to a man who is a folk hero, surrounded by both history and legend. While much of the celebration no longer has anything to do with St. Patrick, this man does deserve to be remembered.

From his writings, we know that Patrick was born in England. In his *Confession*, Patrick tells of being taken as a captive at sixteen years of age by Celtic raiders. He was not particularly religious at this time, but the hardships of slavery led him to turn to God.

He was in bondage for six years, when a vision led him to a certain harbor where he boarded a boat that took him back to England. But Patrick felt called to go to Ireland as a minister of God and to lead the Druid pagans to Christ.

He studied for the priesthood and asked to be sent to Ireland, but his requests were denied. He became a bishop, but still wasn't allowed to go to Ireland. Another bishop, Palladius, was the first to take the Gospel to Ireland. When that mission failed, Patrick was finally given permission to undertake the mission to Ireland.

It took courage to face the warrior chieftains, the Druid magicians and an unbelieving land. But Patrick had a great faith in a great God, and a love for the people who had once treated him as a slave. He travelled across Ireland, sharing the Light of Life–Jesus Christ–with people who were lost in the dark.

It can be hard to separate legend from reality, but Patrick's faith was real. He trusted in the Triune God, and was eager to share his hope with others. We know that his preaching had a dramatic impact on Ireland—and from there to other areas of the world.

Maybe things aren't as rough or as crude as in the days of Patrick, but his message of hope and life in Christ is still badly needed in our world. There are so many still lost in the dark, troubled by loneliness, slaves to the sinful pastimes of this world. God does have an answer for the hurts, the worries, the fears of human hearts. Patrick learned that the reason for hope is found in God's gracious gift of His Son. Through faith in Jesus Christ, Patrick, who was once a slave, found what it meant to truly be free. God can give us all that same freedom in Christ. That is something to celebrate!

Family Time in Christ

The season of Lent began with Ash Wednesday on March 1st. During these 40 days Christians take time to prepare for the celebration of Jesus' resurrection by focusing on our need to repent of our sins and our need for a Saviour from sin. There are a number of Lenten traditions that can be incorporated into your regular family time together.

- 1. LENTEN CENTERPIECE: This idea is very similar to the advent wreath. Make a cross-shaped centerpiece with eight candleholders, with a candle for each week in Lent. You might tie a purple ribbon at the centre of the cross. This centerpiece will visually remind your family of its progress through Lent, keeping the family focused on its preparation for Christ's resurrection at Easter. Finish by tying a purple ribbon where the two pieces of wood cross. Another nice touch is to place a purple tablecloth on the table to correspond with the liturgical colors in the Church. Beginning on March 1st, light all 8 candles at your family devotion time. On March 8th light only 7 candles, and light one less candle each Wednesday until on April 12th you have only two candles left. On April 13th light only one candle, and on April 14th – Good Friday, as you remember the day that Jesus took the full measure of God's punishment for sin and died in our place, light no candles. On Easter Sunday, light all the candles again, and celebrate Jesus' Resurrection!
- **2. READ SCRIPTURE TOGETHER**: This season is a good time to read the Gospel accounts of Christ's Passion (Matthew 26:1-27:66; Mark 14:1-15:47; Luke 22:1-23:56; John 18:1-19:42). Choose one account and read it through Lent, discussing any questions your children have. For younger children, use a Children's Bible.

- **3. VISIT THE SICK**: If you don't have an elderly family member nearby, find out if there is someone in the church who is homebound or in a nursing home and adopt an elderly person as a grandparent. Make a family commitment to keep up your visits and encourage this person throughout the year. During visits you can share photos, play cards or board games, or just talk. Pray for this person regularly.
- **4. FAMILY FASTING:** Fasting doesn't need to mean giving up food. It could mean giving up a computer game or a weekly television show. Use that time for Scripture reading, family prayer, or a family service project.
- **5. SING TOGETHER**: Bring a hymnal home and make a point of singing a Lenten song together. Singing before, during or after any family prayer is a good reminder that Lent is passing and the time for rejoicing is nearer than the day before.
- **6. PALM SUNDAY:** If you receive palms at the worship service, bring them home and place them behind a cross or a picture of Jesus. Let them dry and then use them next year to make ashes for Ash Wednesday.

A Peek Into Our Preschool

During the month of January, we read many books on dinosaurs. One book, The Mine-O-Saur by Bardhan-Quallen was a favorite. The dinosaur was called a Mine-O-Saur because he did not like to share with his school friends. He would repeat, "MINE! MINE! MINE!" However, by the end of the story, he had mended his selfish ways. Children in this age group, are better able to see a solution to a problem if it is enacted with another child (even a dinosaur child) in the story than if they are in a similar situation in real life. Jesus told parables for similar reasons.

After reading the book, the children used their developing scissor skills to cut out legs and body for a protoceratops. They glued the pieces to a head and tail that were already cut for them. The children were then asked to tell the story of their mine-o-saur to one of the 3 adults in the room so their story could be written down to go with their picture.

Here are some of their stories:

My dinosaur likes white ice cream. He likes to share and read books to friends. He likes football.

My mine-o-saur does not like to share anything. He is lonely.

My mine-o-saur now likes to share blocks with his friends.

My mine-o-saur says, "Mine! Mine! Mine!" His brother is sad.

My dinosaur is a kind one. He likes ice cream. White is his favorite color.

My mine-o-saur says, "No Sharing! All the toys are mine! All the food is mine!"

My mine-o-saur now wants to share with her friends. She likes to share dolls.

My mine-o-saur does not want to share his toys. He says, "Mine! Mine! Mine!" His friends don't want to play with him

My mine-o-saur now likes to share hugs with his mommy. He puts toys in the sandbox and shares trucks with an elephant.

My mine-o-saur says, "I don't share!"

My dinosaur is a firefighter. He likes to help people.

My dinosaur likes green. She likes strawberries and playing games with her friends.

My mine-o-saur now likes to share cars with his son.



This is a wonderful time to look at our lives under God's grace, and to see it as time of spiritual renewal.

A Time for Meditation

At our special midweek Lenten services we pause to review all that our Saviour has done for us through His death and resurrection. We invite you to join us in spirit at the foot of the cross, and spend time each Wednesday endeavouring to understand more fully the blessings that are ours in Christ and their meaning for our lives today.



A Time of Repentance

Lent is a time for us to "search our hearts and see if there be any wicked way in us." Let us take stock of our spiritual lives and make this Lenten season one of renewal for us.

A Time for Good Works

While Christians should always "abound in every good work," it is the message of Lent - of all that Christ was willing to do for us to save us from our sins - that should prompt us to want to show our appreciation to Him in some way. This Lent, decide on at least one special way in which you can glorify Christ. We suggest that one of the best "works" we can do for Jesus is to bring someone else to know Him better. You can do this by personally witnessing or by asking him/her to come with you to the Lenten services where they will hear the Gospel in all its fullness.

A Time for Renewal

It takes time to search our souls - to meditate in earnest on what our Lord did for us - and to share our faith with others in some way by deeds of love. But if we do this, then this Lenten season will prove to be a time of religious "renewal" in the best sense of the word. We will be blessed tremendously. Will this happen to you this Lent?

Our Theme this Lenten season is: Reconciled and Reconciling. Each semon draws on a text of Scripture that focuses on a person or a parable of our Lord's that illustrates an aspect of God's gracious work of reconciliation in Christ. St. Paul reminds us: "Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation" (2 Corinthians 5:18, ESV) We, who have been reconciled do indeed serve our Lord in the ministry of reconciliation.
