Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

One of the great events that has been part of the 50 for Fifty was our *Prayer Vigil*. From the end of service on Good Friday, until Easter morning, we were blessed in the members who took time to go to God in prayer for the needs of the congregation, for the needs of others, and for the concerns of their lives.

The joy of knowing people were praying around the clock got me thinking about a Gallop poll I saw years ago. I went looking and found the stats from 1985, which noted that 85% of the Americans surveyed take some moments of prayer, meditation or contemplation. Although I am not exactly sure what that means, I assume it means that 85% of the people pray regularly. The survey also included the results for various countries: Ireland had 81% say they prayed, Italy 72%, Great Britain 50%, France 44%, and Sweden was at the bottom of the list with only 33%. While Canada was not listed in this survey, a study done a few years ago by a professor at the University of Lethbridge found that 80% of Canadians "do not give evidence of embracing the central elements of Christianity, belief in God, the divinity of Jesus, life after death, experience of God, and prayer."

How important is prayer to you as a Christian? So often we save prayer as a last resort for the really rough times of our lives; for those times we just feel so overwhelmed. But, in the hymn, *What a Friend We Have In Jesus* we sing, "What a privilege to carry *everything* to God in prayer."

Prayer is a real privilege for us. Just think about it: the Lord of All asks, encourages and even tells us to pray to Him, to come to Him in the problems and pains of life. He also tells us to pray with thanksgiving for the wonderful blessings we experience in life. He invites us to come and have a heart to heart talk to Him, just as children talk with a father who loves them.

Do we consider it a privilege to pray? Do we bother to take the time to pray? Jesus says that we have not, because we ask not. Since God promises to hear and to answer our prayers, it only makes sense that we should make every effort to come to Him, to share the deep feelings of our heart with Him, and to let Him help us in all things. "Oh, what peace we often forfeit, oh what needless pain we bear, all because we do not carry everything to God in prayer."

Prayer is not some sort of magic potion that brings us everything we want. But prayer is our opportunity to pour out our hearts before God and ask Him to be with us in all the joys and sorrows of our lives. "Prav without ceasing,", Scripture tells us. (1 Thessalonians 5:17, ESV) Pray for your needs, and pray with joy and thanksgiving for the blessings God has given you. Pray for your family and friends, that God would bless them in every physical and spiritual need. Pray for me as your pastor and for our church family that God would increase our faith and builds us up in love for one another. Pray for our community, our world, for the spread of the gospel of Jesus Christ. Pray without ceasing, and let God show how He can help those who call upon Him in prayer. Pray for our government leaders, too, that they may know the importance of seeking the help and guidance of the only true God in their work as our leaders and legislators.

Family Time in Christ

On June 4th, 50 days after Easter, the Christian Church celebrates Pentecost Day. On this day, the disciples received the gift that Jesus, before His death and resurrection, had promised would be given to them – the Holy Spirit. This is the birth of the Christian Church – the Body of Christ. Take some time in your family to celebrate too!

Bake a cake and decorate it with candles. Light the candles and blow them out with a big breath. The burning candles remind us that God came to the disciples. The Spirit came with a sound of rushing wind!



Make a windsock. Decorate a white paper bag with markers and red tongues of fire. Add red, orange and yellow streamers and hang it outside on a windy (but dry) day, or inside in front of a fan.

Read Acts 2 together over several days. Take time together to notice some things:

- Like all of Jesus' promises, this one (given in Luke 24:46-49) is kept.
- The disciples told the Good News of Jesus' resurrection to people of all nations who were gathered in Jerusalem. The Holy Spirit gave them the ability to speak this Good News in languages that they had never learned. This Good News is for everyone. (Acts 2:1-6)
- The news of the Resurrection was always part of the message which the disciples shared. It is always part of our message too. (Acts 2:22-24)
- The Holy Spirit worked through the message to bring many people (3,000!) to faith in Jesus. He still works through God's Word to bring people to faith and to keep their faith strong. (Acts 2:40-41)
- There are specific things that Christians did together then, and do together now. (Acts 2:42-47). This is what the Church looks like!

Practice telling each other about Jesus' resurrection, and then think about one person that each of you can share this Good News with!

May 7^{th} - **Community Clean Up** – Let's serve our neighbours by cleaning up the property around surrounding buildings and in the open and common spaces. Come prepared with a change of clothes and shoes, work gloves, sunglasses and hats. And if you've purchased an FLC t-shirt please wear it!





May 14th – Show your love on **Mother's Day** by having flowers waiting at the church for you to give to your mom, or other "motherly" women, by purchasing flowers in advance. **Flowers will be pre-sold April 30th, and May 7th.** We will have your order waiting at the church for you when you arrive on May 14th. We will also have a few extra flowers on Mother's Day available for those who missed out on pre-purchasing.

A Final Word on the Stewardship Leadership Experience

This is my last *Foot Print* submission to you as Director of Stewardship. As of the end of June, I will have held this position for two consecutive electoral terms, the maximum allowed under the *Constitution and Bylaws*.

In all my years, if there was a position in church leadership that I had no desire to ever hold, it was the position of Stewardship Director. You see, I had it in my mind that you better grab on to your 'pocketbook' if you saw the Stewardship guy coming. I was wrong! The 'job' isn't about that particular perception at all and, certainly, making one feel coerced or otherwise uncomfortable about his or her financial resources is not even Scriptural (2 Corinthians 9:7). Yes, when it comes to Christian stewardship, there's always that third "T"...Treasure. As you've heard me say 'it costs to run the church', and God's Word certainly tells us we are not to be reluctant but, rather, "cheerful" givers, but I believe that if we take care of the other two "T's" - Time and Talent, that Treasure will take care of itself. This notion was fundamental in encouraging your participation each fall during the Time & Talent Survey.

As indicated in the table above (I've shared this before), your commitments of *Time* have shown an encouraging trend over the past three years. Within these comparative statistics, your commitments of 'time' in His Word, through faithful worship service attendance, personal Bible reading & devotion and participation in Bible studies have all shown the same favorable trend. In last fall's survey, 92% of survey respondents committed to regular worship services attendance, 82% of respondents committed to faithful reading of and meditation on His Word, and 78% committed to participate in at least one of FLC's regularly scheduled Bibles Studies. Many more of you are doing the same, notwithstanding you may not have returned the survey. That, of course, is good! When one tallies the number of children and adults in Sunday's "Education Hour", and then adds to that those committed to regular weekly scheduled Bible Studies (e.g., LifeLight, Front to Back @ Bodes, Ladies Bible Study @ Miriam's, Bearspaw Ladies Bible Studies, LWML, Men's Monthly Bible Study & Breakfast), together with all who diligently commit to daily devotion at home, there is no doubt more than half of our regularly attending membership are spending significant 'time' in His Word. The decision to have parents attend those Sunday morning confirmation classes with their children was a smart one!

And then there's the *Talent*. You've also heard me talk in the past about 'gifts'... those special abilities that come natural to you with little effort. Like what? Let's consider some examples... interpersonal skills that enable you to convey genuine God-pleasing 'connections' or empathy, and that foster trust and openness with strangers/visitors and those in need. Think about serving on the Board of Human Care Ministries and/or serving as an Usher or Welcome Greeter. Consider supporting Pastor Eric in his University of Calgary outreach work. Communication skills that enable others to readily and accurately understand what you are trying to convey. This is critical to strategic planning, leadership and problem solving. Effective communication skills are fundamental to serving as an officer or director on the PPC. Think about accepting nomination next time 'round! Not just knowledge of, but wisdom of Scripture... and confidence to share with others. Our parish particularly needs your service here on the Boards of Elders, Evangelism or Education. Again, think about accepting a nomination next time 'round or saying 'yes' when a Director asks you to join his/her Board. In this same realm of service, consider joining the Prayer Chain or mentoring our youth and young adults for involvement in worship services. Folks that enjoy preparing food, catering and making it all look and taste good. Think about participation in the Board of Parish Fellowship, coffee teams, the Stampede breakfast, or committing to providing baking for the Sunday fellowship hour. Do you have a knack for managing detail? Think about volunteering as an offerings counter. You're the 'techie-IT type'? Think about learning how to operate the sanctuary sound system, updating and managing the narthex monitor screens, videoing sermons for subsequent post to the parish website... or website management itself. You enjoy fixing things in disrepair without falling off a ladder or bruising one's thumb (or worse); or you take pleasure in beautifying the church, inside or out? Think participation in the Board of Church Properties or the Altar Guild. A good singing voice (aka... ability to go 'up and down' the music note 'hills'... staying in tune *while doing so!*) Join the choir! If you're not yet a team member in one of these areas of service to our parish, please keep this message in mind next fall.

The presentation by lawyer John Carpay, President of the Justice Centre for Constitutional Freedoms, took place in the Auditorium/Theater Room of La Cité des Rocheuses, Calgary's francophone cultural center. I estimate that there were about 100 or more people present.

John Carpay's 1-hour talk was in three parts. In Part 1, he began with some of the 'bad news', how the government has been chipping away and undermining parental authority and involvement in their children's education, then moved on in Part 2 to tracing the legal and constitutional rights of Alberta parents in relation to their children, and concluded, in Part 3, with a more uplifting message as to what can be done.

In Part 1, he began by speaking about Bill 10, passed unanimously in Alberta's legislature in March 2015, which led to the requirement of allowing Gay Straight Alliance (GSA) clubs in schools, if one or more students request it; as well, not allowing for parents to be notified if their child participates in such a club. He pointed out that if you check out the GSA Network's website, you will realize that the "GSAs are promoting an ideology hostile to most religions". He then referenced some of the other troubling issues that have since surfaced:

• The 'Transgender Guidelines' introduced by the Minister of Education in January 2016, which again disconnected the parents from any notification related to their child's sexuality issues and identified 'best practices' such as those who self-identify as the sex opposite to their biological sex, transgenders, are allowed to use the bathroom of their self-identified sex. In early March, a parent and concerned citizen's discovery of links at the GSA Network's website of highly inappropriate sexually-graphic material accessible K-12 children. to (https:// informedalbertans.wordpress.com/2017/03/13/ alberta-government-funds-website-directing-k-12kids-to-sexually-graphic-content/) Carpay described what was recommended for children at these links as "revolting sexual practices", which "tell you the mindset" of those responsible for managing the GSA Network's website, namely, Professor Kris Wells and the institute that he directs, Institute for Sexual Minority Studies and Services (iSMSS), at the University of Alberta. Incredibly, despite severely violating the trust of Albertans and endangering the safety of children, to date there has been no consequence for Dr. Wells and iSMSS. Instead Dr. Wells and iSMSS continue to enjoy the full confidence of the Minister of Education, still being permitted to operate the GSA Network for students and participating in other ways in shaping Alberta's education program through classroom presentations and curriculum reform.

In Part 2, John explained the legal rights of parents, which are spelled out in greater detail in a recent paper that he and an associate prepared, "Protecting Children, Protecting Families – The legal rights of parents to be fully informed on all matters regarding their children's education":

tion is entrenched in international law, Canadian constitutional law and provincial law. For example, The Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), adopted by the U.N. in 1948 after World War II, states in Article 26(3): "Parents have a prior right to choose the kind of education that shall be given to their children".

While, seemingly, it should be a slam dunk in favour of parents legally, John, however, explained that he sees a legal challenge as a last resort for several reasons, including the time to get through the legal system, which could be decades, the high financial cost, and the unpredictability of the outcome despite the apparent strong legal precedents, because of the uncertainty introduced by the unpredictability of the client and liberal judges. Instead, he recommends that, first, the democratic process should be pushed to its fullest through resistance by the public and politicians.

In Part 3, John covered what parents and concerned citizens can do about it, the options available for parents in the new political reality:

1) Despite all, we shouldn't despair as people in different countries and times in history have faced even bigger problems, which they overcame. We are still a largely free county even though our foundations are under aggressive assault,

with tools others didn't have, like freedom of expression and freedom of association. John warned that "freedom is like a muscle; if you don't exercise it, it atrophies".

2) We might feel that we are the only persons concerned about what is happening, however, we are not alone. There is a small aggressive vocal minority that gives the impression that they are the majority voice. The mainstream media is losing its credibility and influence (through social media) every day and, therefore, no need to despair about the biased media.
