Dear friends in Christ:

It is hard to ignore the fact that 2017 is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. There have been many ways that we have tried to keep that before you here at Foothills: with the special notes from Luther's writings in the bulletin; with Bible studies that focus on Luther, the man; and with various discussions and presentations on the history of the Reformation. There will be a few more before the year is over. We celebrate this historic event, because the Reformation has always been about Jesus, and about the Gospel message of *justification by grace through faith*.

There have been special Reformation focusses in Lutheran Church—Canada, too, including articles in *The Canadian Lutheran*. The covers of the magazine have had scenes from Luther's life, as envisioned by Kelly Klages, a writer and artist living in Morden, Manitoba, where her husband Alec is pastor. The latest edition, available to you right now, has a picture based on the room at the Wartburg, where Luther resided for 10 months, under the protection of Elector Frederick the Wise. During that time, Luther gave the church one of the greatest gifts: the German translation of the Greek New Testament, allowing the laity to read the Bible in their own language. His efforts were influential in the translation of the King James Bible, too.

I mention that cover picture, because of the caption on the cover. The caption is the title and opening words of one of Luther's great hymns, Lord, keep us steadfast in Your Word. That is one of the most important prayers that the church of God can pray. In our day and age, in particular, it is so important that we remain steadfast in the Word of God, especially in a world that is so quick to depart from, or even attack, that life-giving Word. I don't think it is unique or coincidental that as I started writing this, I received a satirical news article which said: "In an effort to make sure the public is educated about the drastic effects the Word of God may have upon its readers, the FDA has announced that beginning next year, all new Bibles sold in America must be stamped with a warning from the Surgeon General which notifies them that "Bible Reading Can Cause Belief In Objective Truth, Disagreement With Socially Accepted Values, Faith And Trust In God, And May Forever Change Your Life And Eternity.""

God's Word does change us. More than that, it saves us, as the Spirit creates faith in our hearts through the Gospel. That Word is our comfort, our strength, our peace, our guide, our counsellor, our teacher in so many wonderful ways. Even though we study it our whole lives, we will never exhaust the blessings that the Word of God brings to us.

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Every fall we start the season with our Christian Education Sunday or *Rally Day*. We celebrate the various opportunities we have to *read*, *mark*, *learn and take to heart* that wonderful Word. We use it as a time to encourage you, our members to be in the Word. We remind ourselves how important that Word is for our lives—and, yes, it is important, even if the whole world denies or ignores that Word. We go back to that prayer: "Lord, keep us steadfast in Your Word; curb those who by deceit or sword would wrest the Kingdom from Your Son, and bring to naught all He has done.

If there is one prayer I would have for our congregation, it is that we would be steadfast in the truth of God's Word. There are many who are twisting that Word and corrupting it, seeking to destroy that truth. There are those who will always say that the Bible is just another book, written by men. There are those who will see it as being out of touch with our "enlightened" way of thinking. There are also those who will contradict and deny what God has clearly said in His Word.

Luther understood that God's Word is the strength and help of His people. That Word changes lives. It changes hearts. Those who heed it always find that the Word brings blessing upon blessing. Best of all, it brings us the joy of life in Christ, our Saviour.

In the following pages, look for the ways in which we are at work to be steadfast in that Word. Come, and hear that Word proclaimed each week in our worship. Read it for yourself, and thank God for those who have brought us that Word. And please pray—pray that we would all open our ears and our hearts to that Word, and that we, as a church, will be steadfast in it at all times.



CHILDREN'S CHOIR



Children's choir will resume on Thursday, September 14th at 6:00 pm in the Fireside Room. We are looking forward to having some new voices join us this fall. We learn a bit about music,

learn how to use our voices, and most of all plant God's Word in our hearts through song. Bring your child age 4-10! Please speak with Deaconess Miriam for more information or to register.

GOD'S BUILDING BLOCKS was held July 17-21 and July 24-28, with a total of 156 children attending, and 46 adult and youth



teaching, leading, and supporting in various ways. Focusing on the teachings of the Apostles' Creed, children learned Bible lessons and their application for daily life, and participated in crafts, games and music which supported this learning. Each day introduced a building block of faith, and taught us about our one true God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

On *Monday* we learned how God created the world and everything in it in six days. Human beings were the most special part of His creation. He said everything was very good!

- On *Tuesday* we learned how God's perfect world was broken when Adam and Eve listened to the serpent instead of to God. We also learned that God already had a plan to send a Saviour. He promised His own Son, Jesus!
- On *Wednesday* we learned how Jesus, God's Son, suffered and died for our sins. When He said "it is finished" on the cross, it meant that He had done what God had sent Him to do. Save us!
- On *Thursday* we learned that Jesus' death for us was not the end. On the third day He rose again from the dead, showing that He has destroyed our enemies sin, death and the devil, and promising us a new life with Him!
- On *Friday* we learned how the Holy Spirit came to work through God's Word to bring many people to believe in Jesus. He brought the believers together into God's Church, and still today makes us living stones in Jesus' household of faith!

28% of the children who attended VBS were unchurched. We pray that the seeds of faith that were planted this week would bear abundant fruit!

KIDS BIBLE CLUB will meet Saturday, October 7th from 9:30 – 11:30 am. This year our theme will be Love in Jesus, and we will be looking at the Ten Commandments as gifts from God, and how He works to help us love Him and love others. A Peek Into Our Preschool

Preschool is in session Monday through Friday, so you may not see who is here during the week:

Did You Know:

We have 2 staff members who work in our preschool. (We are blessed, as not every Lutheran school has an all Lutheran staff like we do.) Both have attended FLC for over 30 years:

Betty Ann Chandler, B.Ed., Child Development Supervisor certificate - principal/teacher

Amy Chandler, MA with Merit, Child Development Assistant certificate - teaching/office assistant

While class time lasts from 8:45 to 3:30, professional planning, communication, ministry, and administration take place outside of this time.

FLC Preschool is a pre-kindergarten, not a daycare. We teach literacy, pre-math skills, facilitate fine & gross motor development, encourage creativity, facilitate emotional & social development, and share our faith in Jesus.

Classroom environment is purposefully structured to enable child-directed play to be learning, not recess. Toys/activities deliberately support concepts presented during teacher-directed time. At least 1 toy/activity is changed each day.

We ask parents to volunteer once per month to elevate our adult/child ratio past minimum licensing requirements to better facilitate learning. There is a FLC volunteer, Jutta Culhoun, who comes in if a parent is unavailable. We aim for our ratio to be 1 adult for 6 children.

High needs children have a Child Development Facilitator to support them in the classroom. 4 of our 9 weekly classes will have a CDF this year.

A CDF is NOT the same as a teaching assistant. A teaching assistant manages class behavior, helps with evaluations, and shares her/his faith with the children. A teaching assistant manages volunteers in order to prep art projects and sanitize toys in compliance with government regulations. An assistant issues tuition tax receipts and updates our preschool website.

In contrast, CDFs are assigned to 1 child by their employer. (FLC is not their employer.) A CDF is there to enable that 1 assigned child to participate in the class in a way they can be successful. CDFs write daily observations of that one child noting how they are achieving their individual objectives, which are set by professionals in their own organization. BIG Plans for Little Kids is the primary organization that provides support in our preschool.

These professionals (e.g. speech/language pathologist, occupational therapist) come into the classroom for an hour periodically to observe, evaluate, and give strategies to the CDF for that 1 child. Neither the CDFs nor the professionals' presence in the classroom are counted in the adult/child ratio government licensing requirement since they are there for 1 child only.

You may see a prospective parent visit the preschool classroom

You may see one of our pastors presenting a children's message every other week in the sanctuary. Relating new learning to past learning increases retention, so the pastors try to relate a spiritual concept to other concepts studied in class that week.

We have 54 children registered with us for the new school year. Class size currently ranges from 9 to 21. The morning class is larger since some children nap in the afternoon.

Our students attend 2, 3, 4, or 5 half-days/week, not full-days. This year, 7 students come 5 half-days/week; 6 attend 4 times; 22 attend 3 times; 19 attend twice.

17 of our 3 & 4-year-olds will enter our preschool this year with little or no English. Teaching English is important so that we can share the Gospel effectively with the children. BIG Plans provides a tutor for our ELL 4 year-olds at lunch and after class for 7 months of the year. Approximately 75 people come through our preschool doors on any given preschool day (i.e. parents, children, siblings, staff, CDFs, professionals, etc.). If you would like to be one of those people, to see for yourself, please speak to Betty Ann.

The preschool has served the Lord faithfully for so long, and affected the lives of hundreds of kids and adults, we need to celebrate. Stay tuned for more details.

If you are a parent of kids of any age, we encourage you to come to this event, and submit questions you think your kids may ask and that you would like answers for to Miriam or the pastors in advance. More information to come.

Family Time in Christ

At Foothills Lutheran we have recognized the important role of the family in faith development. We encourage parents in their holy task of teaching in Baptism visits, Faith at Home sessions, family activities, Family Confirmation, and through resource materials. The Lutheran Church of Australia identifies four "Cornerposts" for building faith at home: Receiving the Word, "Faith Talk" in the Home, Faith Rituals and Traditions, and Serving Others (*GrowMinistries*). Notice that before there is any "doing", there has to be "receiving". And it is important that families do this "receiving" together, both in their homes, and as part of the broader family of God in their congregation.

In the context of the nuclear family, the Word is received...

- ...as families set aside regular time for devotions. Family devotions are an opportunity to share Scripture, to remember what God has done for us through His Son, Jesus, to look at what this means in our daily life, and to pray together for the needs of the family. We can help with devotional resources for your family at various ages and stages.
- ...as parents include a Bible reading as part of a bedtime routine. Use a children's Bible or a Bible story book.
- ...as families memorize a passage of Scripture together. Post a whiteboard near your kitchen table where you can post the passage of the week. One family uses erasable markers to write it on their window. What is hidden in the heart through memorization cannot be taken away!

...through Bible songs and Christian music. Equip your vehicle with music that can be played and sung when you're on the road.

In the context of the congregational family, the Word is received...

• ...as families worship together. It's not always easy to worship with children. We know that. They don't catch everything that's going on. We know that. But we also know that God's Word does not return to Him empty (Isaiah 55:11). The rhythm of worship, the liturgy, and the hymns and songs are designed to help even the smallest receive the Word.

...as families engage in study of the Word together with others. Sunday School, Confirmation, Youth and Adult Study allow for engagement in the Word at different age levels, and allow for fellowship in that Word with other members of God's family. Join us!

Over the next newsletters, we will have a look at the other "Cornerposts" for building faith.

In its 16th year, the Foothills Lutheran Sunday morning Stampede breakfast and out-door worship service fed pancakes to 635, and then offered spiritual food to the about 375 who stayed for the church service. Those figures represented all-time high totals in both categories.

Church members invited friends, neighbors, relatives, and co-workers to the long-running event, held in the church's parking lot. The response was so great, organizers scrambled to keep up with food and drink.

Pastor Eric Moffett spoke on "Planted with a Purpose" citing the Parable of the Sower. He noted how often we are reluctant to plant the seed, but the reward can be so great (Matt. 13: 1-9, 18-23). Following the sermon, in Stampede fashion, ushers collected the offering in cowboy hats.

The outreach event also featured door prize quizzes, cowboy poetry (with a Christian angle), and music in the great out-doors.

Cliff Stangland, a retired school teacher, had been invited by a friend. "The food was good," he commented, citing the baked beans and hashbrowns. "And young Eric preached a great sermon. He didn't even use notes."

Newly-minted Member of Parliament Bob Benzen (Calgary-Heritage) attended for the second year in a row. "I have friends here," he commented.

Foothills Member Harold Ziprick, retired Lutheran Church Minister to the Deaf, even "signed" the whole worship service for a deaf attendee.

FAMILY/FRIENDS GARAGE SALE RAISES FUNDS FOR BC FOREST FIRE VICTIMS

My sister Linda Zibin and I had hosted charity garage sales for 15 years, but had been rained out for the last two. Some of our "get up and go" enthusiasm had "got up and left."

We usually sold to support Lutheran charities, such as Canadian Lutheran World Relief. CLWR has a low administration cost percentage, and so we prefer them. However, we thought "closer to home" and so I made a call to a church member, Michelle Schott, who is an accountant with Samaritan's Purse, Calgary. They had recently launched an appeal for B.C. Forest Fire Victim's Relief. Their administration costs hover around 10 percent, she mentioned.

With that, the planning geared up – and I had pretty much reached the point of "no return" for a decision. The garage sale list is endless: inventory, signage, advertising, helpers, display/set-up, etc. – in a word: daunting.

However, the good Lord provides. In a day, I had sale items arriving, including stuff from retired MP Art Hanger. I recruited a cousin, Arla Marshall from Manitoba, plus a niece from Edmonton, who coerced her University of Calgary friend, Amanda Lauder, to help. A buddy innocently showed up from Vancouver to visit family and friends for a week. I drafted Wes Yocom for duty.

Four days later, our "Friends, Family, Neighbors Garage Sale" was a success as we raised about \$1500 for Samaritan's Purse. We raised an additional \$1000 for Lutheran charities.

We finished tired, but happy. We have a year's worth of stories, some slightly embellished for dramatic effect. Most of all though, we worked together on a project with a higher calling: taking care of all God's children.

As this day consists of volunteers, I ask you to prayerfully consider how you might be a part of this project. **There are many ways you can participate:**



- 1) Sign up to volunteer on October 21st, whether it's for 2 hours or all day we're flexible (if you're here over lunch WE'LL FEED YOU!);
- Sign up to volunteer and bring one (or more) items on our list of food needed to the meals we will cook (PLEASE ensure you mark your contribution on the "Product Requirement Sheet on the '50 for 50' bulletin board);
- 3) Donate food items that are on the list (please mark on the sheet what you will donate). There are sheets to fill out to remind you what you have signed up to donate;
- 4) Monetary donations to help us buy the fresh items we need, and
- 5) Pray for the individuals who are considering assisting in this project and for the many mouths that we can feed.

When we cook in bulk and package in this way, we can assemble many meals for a very low cost. For example, a spaghetti supper to feed 4 people is LESS than \$5.00 when we cook in bulk.

WHY I CHOSE FOOTHILLS LUTHERAN CHRISTIAN PRESCHOOL

When my husband and I moved to Calgary nearly 10 years ago, we went about the business of finding a church "home". When our oldest daughter was born, I felt the importance of raising her in the Christian faith and becoming members of a church that would support me in that endeavour. I wasn't looking for splashy kid's stuff full of fluff, but a church where the preaching was based solidly on the foundation of the Word of God paired with program opportunities to help me in my new role as Mom. As my daughter grew (and two more were added in quick succession) I learned that our church was also hiding a preschool in the basement! I was very impressed by the information I read about it. I was witness to the care given each child, the consideration given to children with special needs and quirks, the purposefulness of the lesson plans, and the time given to mental, emotional, physical, and spiritual growth. I was especially impressed with the consistent message of God's love for each child that was shared with them and their families. What an outreach!

How blessed we are to have a church and a preschool that truly cares about families and sharing the Gospel with young and old. I thank God that we are a church body that recognizes how important it is to teach each generation about God's love for each and every one of us. I thank God for a preschool with a principal dedicated to showing the love of God to everyone coming through those basement doors, and I pray that the ministry of our church and preschool would continue for many more years to come.

Over 4,400, or 66%, still have no portion of Scripture. We think of Pastor Mike and Kara Kuhn, working with LBT in Galim, Cameroon so the Nizaa people can read God's Word.

October: LAMP

Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots has been providing spiritual witness and nurturing faith in communities in northern remote areas of Canada, most accessible only by plane, since 1970. Through the ministry of pastor/missionary pilots and short- and long-term volunteers-in-mission various programs bring the Gospel to these isolated areas. Each year over 5000 children, youth and adults are impacted by the ministry of LAMP.
