Dear Friends in Christ:

As I sit down to write this article, our observance of Mother's Day is just around the corner. Of course, this Foot Print spans May and June–the times when we observe both Mother's Day and Father's Day. While advertisers are now encouraging us to remember mom on her special day, there continues to be a fairly noticeable difference between Mother's Day and Father's Day celebrations. Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1872; Father's Day was first celebrated in 1910. And while President Wilson set the 2nd Sunday in May as Mother's Day in 1912, it wasn't until 1966 that President Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the 3rd Sunday of June as Father's Day.

The differences go on. Restaurants tell us that Mother's Day is their second busiest day of the year. Father's Day, though, is just another Sunday. Mothers are given special gifts to brighten their days. Dads receive gifts, too–usually something very practical, and so we have the stereotype of the black socks or the new tie.

Mothers are seen as the nurturers and the care-givers of the family. Fathers are practical people. We think of fathers as being concerned with rules, with work and with the house. It is mothers who are concerned with the home. We hold up a mother's love for her children as the purest and strongest of loves. But fathers are seen in a different light. Fathers care, fathers love, but somehow we perceive this to be different than the love of a mother for her children.

Whether or not we honour them in different ways, fathers and mothers really aren't different. They are both entrusted by God with the care of the children that He has created, in the realm of the family that He has established. That is why God says so much about our home and family life in the Bible. I remember someone pointing out before the birth of my first child that children don't come with instruction manuals. But there is a handbook for parents, prepared for us by the Creator of the family; by the Father who first loved us.

In a day and age when both mom and dad seem to be struggling in their roles; in a time when many families are going through difficult times, we might be surprised to learn that the secret to a good family is simple: "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labour in vain" (Psalm 127:1) With His blessings, we have something to celebrate in our homes, as father, mother and children live together in love and care under God's guiding hand. (You may also want to look at the Table of Duties that Luther included in his Small Catechism. It talks about the vocation of fathers and mothers, as God describes this work in Scripture).

Happy Mother's Day, to all our moms! God bless you in your care and ministry to your families. You are doing the work the Lord has called you to do.

Happy Father's Day, to all our dads! God bless you in your care and ministry to your families. You are doing the work the Lord has called you to do.

Family Support Project – Update (March 16, 2018)

"For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself." -- Galatians 5:14 Entering 2018, we can reflect on the success of the Calgary Circuit Refugee Family Support Project and the contributions of each of our congregations. We exceeded our goal of \$30,000 and have donated the current project balance of \$33,300 – well done!

Andrea Sovary, on behalf of St. Matthew and the Calgary Circuit, has kindly agreed to manage and disburse project funds during the reception and resettlement phase. The project is also blessed by Sabine Dillenberg who has joined the Circuit committee and will record human and material resources pledged in favour of our sponsored family.

Moving forward, we completed the formal sponsorship application in partnership with the Canadian Lutheran World Relief, last week. Today we received approval of our application! Following the Federal Government's release of refugee allocations for 2018, the Circuit committee decided to sponsor a Blended Visa Office Referred (BVOR) family of four. The BVOR program has two clear advantages. First, the refugees will arrive within four (4) to eight (8) weeks from the time our application is processed. And second, the Government of Canada will enter into a 50/50 cost-sharing arrangement with the LCC Calgary Circuit for one year; this will definitely deliver better mileage from the financial donations!

Immigration Canada advises that our family has fled the conflict in the Sudan and currently resides in a UNHCR transit camp in Cairo, Egypt. We anticipate their arrival in Canada on or after 15 May 2018. Calgary has a vibrant Sudanese community which augers well toward embracing these new Canadians comprising: a father (58), mother (51), son (21) and daughter (19). We have received many commitments for household items to help the family set-up home -a heartfelt thank you is extended to all who have contributed! As the generosity of our congregations continues, a storage locker has been leased to concentrate donations of furniture, clothing, and household items - the location is Sentinel Storage, 410 Manning Road N.E. Starting at the beginning of March and on every Saturday thereafter, the locker can be manned from 13h00 to 16h00 to receive deliveries. This arrangement will be by *appointment only*; please contact Theo Dillenberg at 403.971.0950 or Cathy Weger at 403.225.1168 to coordinate receipt of your donations. While donations will be accepted with

heartfelt gratitude, it is requested that items be in good repair, clean and appropriate for our family. Currently, we remain in need of more individuals willing to donate time and effort in support of resettlement functions. If you are interested in contributing specific talents, please review and complete a Refugee Sponsorship commitment survey or by contacting Sabine Dillenberg at Sabine.Dillenberg@shaw.ca

In closing, think about how we, as a collective force of the Lutheran Church of Canada, are making a difference by bringing our resources together in Calgary to help a family in need. Excerpt from the Canadian Lutheran: "Shall We Gather at the Gathering"



"As many LCC congregations have discovered, it's not always possible to form a youth fellowship. But that shouldn't' stop young people from taking part in youth gatherings at the district or national level. Organizers of "Unmasked"-the 2018 Alberta-British Columbia District Youth Gathering — are trying to emphasize that point. They want to give all Lutheran youth from across their district (and the Central District too!) the opportunity to be together for one weekend every three years to hear and be strengthened by God's Word. This year's gathering takes place from July 5 to 8 at the University of Alberta Augustana Campus in Camrose.

The ABC District gathering's organizing committee believes it is vital to nourish the Christian beliefs in which young people were raised at a time in their lives when they face challenges from other ideas in society. Committee chair Michelle Heumann emphasizes that a lot of that nourishing begins at the congregational level. She refers to research done by Dr. James Gimbel at Concordia Lutheran Seminary in Edmonton showing that the more adults in a congregation interact with the youth, the more likely those youth will keep attending church when they are older. LCC's partner synod, the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS) has also researched attracting and keeping youth. A survey for the LCMS 2018 Youth Ministry Symposium shows that congregations that hired youth ministry staff have higher rates of youth retention than other congregations. So-called members of the Millennial demographic (those who became adults in the early 21st Century), make up 15% of LCMS congregations in a society where most young adults are not attending church."

"Proponents of youth gatherings don't seem to express many negative things about them. Their only complaint is that attendance numbers are never what they wish for. The events however provide opportunities for youth to ask hard questions about faith and theology and discuss their questions confidentially if they want. Michelle Heumann emphasizes that participants at the upcoming ABC youth gathering will have that opportunity...There seems to be a general theme of youth gatherings cultivating discussion as a way of forming young people in their faith and giving them a sense of lifelong commitment to their Lord

Stressing the importance of religious instruction for young people, Martin Luther wrote, 'If an injury that really hurts is to be done [to] the devil, it must be inflicted through the young people who are reared in the knowledge of God, spread God's Word and teach it to others.' Our society increasingly marginalizes and even ridicules a biblical Christian worldview. In response, all believers need the gifts God provides in His Word and Sacraments, even more so our young people who face daily challenges to their faith."

The first few months of parenthood are hard. Sleepless nights, mental and physical exhaustion, and the emotional adjustments. But with a strong network of support, you get through it. People drop by, share advice and a helping hand. We fee gratitude for small mercies -- times when someone drops off a meal or maybe just lends an ear or another set of arms to sooth a fussy baby.

Now, imagine adjusting to life as a new mom in a foreign country without any outside support besides your partner. Then add postpartum depression to the mix -- an overwhelming and explainable heaviness that just won't go away. You are exhausted and in despair, not knowing where to turn.

This was Karina's experience. In Canada on a student visa, Karina met and fell in love with Ryan, and a few months later realized she was pregnant. Determined to parent, Karina was forced to decide whether to stay in Canada with Ryan or to return home to her family.

This is when she came to the Centre for help. Despite the financial challenges and limited support, Karina decided to stay with Ryan so they could raise their son together. She accessed pre-natal instruction, maternity clothing and one-on -one support.

Shortly after the birth of her son, Karina began to experience postpartum depression symptoms she had learned about in the Centre's prenatal class. Karina met with her prenatal instructor to address the anxious and fearful thoughts she was battling and she was connected with the help she needed. When finances were tight, Ryan and Karina were connected with NeighborLink to take off some of the pressure.
