


Our Ministry of the Week

OUR BOARD OF STEWARDSHIP seeks to encourage our congregational members in using all that God has given us to His glory—our time, our talents, our treasures. One way is through our Ministry of the Week.

This week's highlighted ministry is our Altar Guild.

Caring for God's altar is a ministry that goes back to the days of the tabernacle itself. What is "making the sign of the cross"?

Making the sign of the cross means to draw an invisible cross on yourself at certain times during personal prayer, the Divine Service, and other kinds of worship.

How do I do it?

Take your thumb and two fingers and hold them together. Next, touch your forehead, then your tummy, then your left shoulder, then your right shoulder, and finally your chest. You can remember it by saying to yourself: "Forehead, tummy, left, right, and middle." Try it a few times and you'll get it. Before long, it will be easy to do!

Why do it?

FOR PARENTS

Before or after the service, practice making the sign of the cross with your children. Remind them that we may do it at certain times during the service, for example, anytime you see a small red cross symbol in your hymnal, or the pastor makes the sign of the cross on the congregation.

Can you think of that time when the sign of the cross was first made on you by your pastor? If you guessed "at my baptism," then you guessed right! When we make the sign of the cross, we are reminded of our baptism. At your baptism, you received the sign of the cross on your forehead and on your heart to mark you as one redeemed by Christ! Making the sign of the cross is a great way to remember all that Jesus has done for you on the cross and has given to you through your baptism!
