The mission of Inn from the Cold is to provide emergency shelter, support and programs to homeless children, their families and others in need, with the goal of building healthy, stable families and ending homelessness. A number of churches, community associations and organizations have come together to provide emergency shelter and resources for Calgary's homeless. These Community Inns continue to operate on a rotating basis, 365 days a year, and are located in communities across Calgary. Inn from the Cold also operates Calgary's first Emergency Family Shelter.

FOR ALL THE SAINTS – What is a saint, and why All Saints’ Sunday?

Derived from the Latin “Sanctus,” the word “saint” means “holy.” As such saints are holy ones, those who have been chosen by God and set apart for a divine purpose. In a broad sense all Christians are saints because all Christians have been chosen by God, marked by the cross of Christ in Holy Baptism, and set apart to bear witness in the world to God’s grace. We also speak of the Christians whom the Church has designated as exemplary models of the Christian faith and life. The Augsburg Confession states, “It is also taught among us that saints should be kept in remembrance so that our faith may be strengthened when we see what grace they received and how they were sustained by faith.”

We do not consider saints sinless nor do we ask them to mediate with God on our behalf. We thank God for the saints’ examples; we let their examples strengthen us, and seek to imitate these examples as best we can.

One way that we remember the saints is by observing saints’ days. A saint’s day is usually the day that the saint died, often by being martyred, and entered eternal life. Sometimes, important or highly significant saints’ days may be observed on Sunday. When this occurs, the hymns, prayer of the day, lessons, and sermon usually reflect the person’s life. Observing the saint’s day enriches the liturgical year as it enriches our spiritual lives.

On the Feast of All Saints (November 1) the Church remembers major and minor saints as well as those saints whose godly life of service is known and remembered only by God Himself. We also make use of the pause that this feast day affords us to think about the unity of the Church Universal —about *all* of God’s saints, both living and dead and as we consider this blessed unity which is built on faith alone, we may give thanks to God, the Giver of faith, and give thanks for the means of grace, Word and Sacrament. The Feast of All Souls or the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed (November 2) gives the Church the opportunity to give tanks for all those who have died in saving faith, especially those from the local parish who were called home by God during the last year. We especially wish to remember in connection with this day that our loved ones who have died in faith are still very much a part of our lives: not just in our memories, but through their continued existence in Christ, Who keeps them connected to us through His mystical union with all the saints.
