MISSION OF THE MONTH – Robert Ohlinger Scholarship Fund

The Robert Ohlinger Scholarship Fund was set up to assist Foothills Lutheran members who are studying to go into professional church work. It is administered by the Board of Elders of Foothills Lutheran Church. The fund was initiated by donations in memory of Robert Ohlinger, the oldest son of our Pastor Emeritus, Eldon Ohlinger, and his wife, Marian. Robert was struck and killed by a car in May 1975 at the age of 14 as he was walking home from a school band activity. Robert played clarinet, bass clarinet, piano and guitar. He enjoyed using his musical gifts as one of FLC's musicians for Sunday morning folk services.

WE WILL SOON BE DISTRIBUTING THE NEW OFFERING ENVELOPES for 2020. As we prepare for this, we want to give you a little encouragement on how to use those envelopes wisely and well.

Foothills operates with what is known as a Unified Budget—in other words, all the things we plan to do come (for the most part) out of what is typically referred to as a *Current Account*. We also have special *Mission of the Month* projects, along with the odd special need that arises (such as the *Organ Fund*).

Your offering envelope has three lines, designed to help you give your tithes and offerings to the Lord.

Weekly Budget refers to that unified budget, or the church operating budget. Gifts to the weekly budget needs support the work of the church by providing funds that pay salaries, provide for building maintenance, bulletin costs, etc. Basically, all our work is funded through this line. This includes our mission commitment to Lutheran Church—Canada, to help support the synod, sponsor new congregations and provide for our seminaries.

Special Mission Projects is the money that supports the various efforts we seek to support outside our own congregation. This refers to our *Mission of the Month* efforts. You could also write on this line your designated mission gift, say to Lutheran Hour Ministries or the Mustard Seed. Any amounts on this line that are not designated by name are credited to our Mission of the Month.

Other allows you to designate any specific need or fund in our church. We ask that you write in the name of the fund, such as *Flowers* or *Organ Fund*. Any amounts on this line that are not designated by name are credited to our Mission of the Month.

Where should you give your offering? That is up to you. We cannot maintain our church and its programs without support of the weekly budget, nor can we do the outreach work that is necessary without our support of Missions. We always remember that we give as God has given to us, for we are stewards, entrusted with blessings from our Master.

The gifts of God's people allow us to serve the Lord and His people in His church. Even as we have been struggling the last little while, especially with the challenging economy in Alberta, we would have to confess that we have been richly blessed, and that God enables us to do great things by His grace. We are confident that ***He who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ***. (Philippians 1:6 - ESV) We know that, with the help of God, we will be able to meet the goals we have undertaken.


How much should you give? Scripture says: ***Each one must give as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver***. (2 Corinthians 9:7 - ESV) We are encouraged in Scripture to:

- ***Give regularly*** - we should set aside a portion of our income weekly (and yes, even when we are absent) for the work of the Lord's church.
- ***Give faithfully*** - recognize that it is God who has provided all we have. He entrusts it to us, to be used properly and to His glory. This also includes the fact that we should give first to the Lord, not from the leftovers we have.
- ***Give generously*** - we are not to worry about our fair share or simply giving to the budget. We are to give from our hearts, especially the heart that is overjoyed at knowing the wonderful blessings of God.

May God enable us to be faithful stewards throughout the whole year!

ADVENT

*Begins the fourth Sunday before December 25,
or the Sunday closest to St. Andrew (November 30),
and ends with midday prayer on December 24.*



The Savior's birth is second in importance only to His resurrection on Easter Sunday. During the Time of Christmas, Christians reflect on God's great and gracious gift of Himself.

The Church Year begins with Advent (from Latin *adventus*, which means "coming into"), a four-week period of preparation before Christmas. The story of Jesus during Advent is the story of hope coming into the world. When the time was just right, God sent His Son, Jesus, into the world. The Advent season teaches us to prepare to receive Jesus, the hope of the world.

In Advent, we wait for our coming King.
