AN UPDATE ON OUR IN-PERSON WORSHIP: We're ready to invite you back! Here's what's happening in our new 'normal':

- Our service at 10:15 am will be both an in-person service, as well as live-streamed. We do not require
  congregants to register, but we will be observing physical distancing protocols. In order to make the
  best use of our available space, please be aware that you may be seated in different place than normal.
- All members will sign in at the Reception station.
- Ushers will seat members.
- In accordance with the new city bylaw, masks will be required for all worshippers.
- We hope to have a cantor or small cohort of cantors singing our hymns and songs. The hymns will still be projected, but people will be asked not to sing.

We will not stream the distribution of Holy Communion. This will be held as part of the in-person services according to our regular Communion schedule. Private / individual communion appointments will still be available as requested.

We are eager to have members back together. God calls us to be a *communion of saints*. Yet we remind you that we are called to care for one another body and soul. You should not attend if you have returned from travel outside Canada within the last 14 days; if you have had close contact with or cared for someone diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last 14 days; if you have been in close contact with anyone who has travelled outside Canada within the last 14 days; or if you have experienced any cold or flu-like symptoms in the last 14 days (to include fever, cough, sore throat, respiratory illness, difficulty breathing) If the answer is "yes" to any of the questions, access to worship cannot be granted at this time.

We continue to pray that God, in His grace, would allow us to return to the joy of worship together and fellowship together as His people, through Jesus Christ!

## Creative Response

The prophet isalah declared God's intention to make his house a "house of prayer for all nations" (isalah 56:7).

Use this creative prayer idea to make your home a 'house of prayer' for others. Pass around a bag or bowl of M&Ms (or equivalent sweet) when your household gathers for prayer. Let each person take a handful, but don't let anyone eat them yet. Explain that the colour of the M&Ms will indicate the direction of your prayers. Lead your household in prayer using this guide:

- For every red M&M, pray for a member of your family by name.
- · For every green M&M, pray for a friend or neighbour.
- For every orange M&M, pray for a teacher in your life.
- For every yellow M&M, pray for someone in need.
- For every dark brown M&M, pray for a leader in your life.
- For every blue M&M, pray for Christians in other places.
- · For any other colour, offer a prayer of your choice!
