A CONFIRMATION MEETING for new and returning students and their parents will be held Tuesday, September 8th at 7:00 pm. Letters were mailed to the families we know should be enrolled. If you did not receive a letter or an email, or think your child should be in Confirmation, please speak to the pastor.

AN UPDATE ON OUR IN-PERSON WORSHIP: We're ready to invite you back! Here's what's happening in our new 'normal':

- Our service at 10:15 am will be both an in-person service, as well as live-streamed. We do not require congregants to register, but we will be observing physical distancing protocols. In order to make the best use of our available space, please be aware that you may be seated in different place than normal.
- All members will sign in at the Reception station.
- Ushers will seat members.
- In accordance with the new city bylaw, masks will be required for all worshippers.
- We hope to have a cantor or small cohort of cantors singing our hymns and songs. The hymns will still be projected, but people will be asked not to sing.

We will not stream the distribution of Holy Communion. This will be held as part of the in-person services according to our regular Communion schedule. Private / individual communion appointments will still be available as requested.

We are eager to have members back together. God calls us to be a *communion of saints*. Yet we remind you that we are called to care for one another body and soul. You should not attend if you have returned from travel outside Canada within the last 14 days; if you have had close contact with or cared for someone diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last 14 days; if you have been in close contact with anyone who has travelled outside Canada within the last 14 days; or if you have experienced any cold or flu-like symptoms in the last 14 days (to include fever, cough, sore throat, respiratory illness, difficulty breathing) If the answer is "yes" to any of the questions, access to worship cannot be granted at this time.

We continue to pray that God, in His grace, would allow us to return to the joy of worship together and fellowship together as His people, through Jesus Christ!
