

WHAT WILL THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER LOOK LIKE? Bible studies, Sunday School, Confirmation and more are part of our normal opportunities for growth and encouragement. We are still trying to determine how best to offer these things so that our members feel secure; so that we can safely follow proper protocols; so that we can be together safely. As we find the best approach to our ministry efforts, we will share it with you.

We do remind you that we have in-person services on Sunday at 10:15 am and Wednesday at 6:30 pm. These services are both live-streamed, too.

- We do not require congregants to register, but we will be observing physical distancing protocols. In order to make the best use of our available space, please be aware that you may be seated in a different place than normal.
- All members will sign in at the Reception station.
- Ushers will seat members.
- In accordance with the new city bylaw, masks will be required for all worshippers.
- We hope to have a cantor or small cohort of cantors singing our hymns and songs. The hymns will still be projected, but people will be asked not to sing.

Holy Communion will be held as part of the in-person services according to our regular Communion schedule. Private / individual communion appointments will still be available as requested.

If you have returned from travel outside Canada within the last 14 days; if you have had close contact with or cared for someone diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last 14 days; if you have been in close contact with anyone who has travelled outside Canada within the last 14 days; or if you have experienced any cold or flu-like symptoms in the last 14 days (to include fever, cough, sore throat, respiratory illness, difficulty breathing) please do not attend at this time.

We continue to pray that God, in His grace, would allow us to return to the joy of worship together and fellowship together as His people, through Jesus Christ!
