

- Give regularly we should set aside a portion of our income weekly (and yes, even when we are absent) for the work of the Lord's church.
- Give faithfully recognize that it is God who has provided all we have. He entrusts it to us, to be used properly and to His glory. This also includes the fact that we should give first to the Lord, not from the leftovers we have.
- Give generously its not about our fair share or simply giving to the budget. We are to give from our hearts, especially the heart that is overjoyed at knowing the wonderful blessings of God.

# Called to Serve Guided by the Spirit Through Word and Sacrament

Although COVID-19 has impacted so many areas of our lives, the work of LWMLC continues to spread the love of Jesus around the world and at home.

During the last months our Foothills Society has supported Lutheran Bible Translators, LAMP, and the Malabar Mission in India. Locally they prepared and delivered gift bags for each of the Manor Residents and continue to reach out to shut-ins. This year's "Christmas Stocking" donations gathered at monthly society meetings have been designated for a needy family.

However, funds are still urgently needed to honour commitments made to: Rancheria Feeding and Education Program, Nicaragua; Evangelists/Deaconesses, Nicaragua; Circuit Rider transportation, Atlantic Canada and the Evangelism outreach course, CLTS, St. Catharines. New projects will be approved at the LWMLC virtual Convention in July.
