SUNDAY SCHOOL: "A Soldier Believes" is the focus of today's Bible lesson. In Philippi, Paul and Silas cast the spirit of divination from a slave girl, but her angered owner has the two thrown into prison. Around midnight, Paul and Silas are praying and singing to God when suddenly an earthquake shakes the prison. The jailer, thinking his prisoners have escaped, prepares to take his own life. Paul and Silas interrupt his plan as they share the Gospel with him and his whole family, whom Paul then baptizes. Discuss how God uses events in our lives to give us opportunities to share His Word.

# Hey! What happened to the "A" word?

There's one word that we use often in the church that isn't used during Lent. Usually, we will use it after invitatories. responsories, antiphons, and other parts of our worship. Have you guessed what the word is yet? If you guessed "Alleluia," then you got it right. We stop singing and saying "Alleluia" during Lent, and we won't use it again until Easter morning.

# What does "Alleluia" mean and why do we stop using it during Lent?

"Alleluia" is a Hebrew word that means "Praise the Lord." Since we are focusing on the sufferings and death of Jesus during Lent, we stop using this joyful word until the day

## FOR PARENTS

During worship, help your children to look for places in the service where Alleluia has been omitted. Notice the writing in red in the front part of the hymnal. These words will help to point out when and where we might use or refrain from using the "A" word.

of Jesus' glorious resurrection. Then on Easter morning, the first words you will hear will be: "The Lord is risen. He is risen indeed! ALLELUIA!"
