Dear members in Christ,

Greetings in our Saviour's name.

You are receiving this letter because your congregation has benefited from the "Support My Congregation" online giving portal. It has been one year since Lutheran Church-Canada provided a means for members to give their tithes and offerings to their home congregation via online donations through LCC's website. Without a doubt, this opportunity to give has been well utilized. In total, over the past 12 months, just under \$480,000 has been donated through this option, benefiting 120 congregations. Praise be to God!

During this time, LCC has covered the transaction costs of each donation totaling approximately \$14,000. This means that every dollar donated went directly to a congregation. Commencing at the beginning of April, LCC will start retaining a 3% transaction fee off each donation to cover this cost going forward. Members will continue to receive a charitable receipt for the full value of their donation while the congregation will receive proceeds net of the transaction fee (i,e, \$100 donation less \$3 fee = \$97 net to the congregation).

We anticipate that as more congregations resume normal public worship services, the amount of donations through the online portal may diminish. However, due to its usefulness, especially to those congregations that may not have other online giving options, it will remain in place for the foreseeable future. Please share this with your members and let them know that they can continue to use the LCC online portal if they choose.

# Why do we have a week called "Holy Week"?

Why would we refer to a week as being holy? The word "holy" means that it is from God. That's why we call the Bible "holy." It isn't just any book. It is God's living Word given to us for our salvation! The same goes for Holy Week. This is "God's Week." This is the week in the Church Year when Jesus actually paid for our sins and won our salvation!



There are particular days during Holy Week that are extra special. During Holy Week we celebrate Palm Sunday, when Jesus went to Jerusalem and people celebrated His arrival; Maundy Thursday, when Jesus instituted the Lord's Supper; Good Friday, when Jesus died on the cross; and Holy Saturday, when we await His resurrection on Easter Sunday!











### Parents:

During worship, help your children to look for other things in the church that are considered holy (i.e. God's Word, the Sacraments, etc.). Ask them: "How does God use these things to give us His forgiveness?"
