SPECIAL COVID UPDATE

ONCE AGAIN, THE STRUGGLES WITH COVID are impacting our society and our congregation. Even as we hope for a positive end of COVID, we find ourselves dealing with the surge in COVID infections that have brought the latest round of mandatory public health restrictions and which impact our worship together.



The Elders discussed how to approach these days. The restrictions are that are in affect for the next 3 weeks (May 9, 16, and 23) mean that worship numbers in the city of Calgary are restricted to 15 people. We realized that there are already a certain number of people who are required to hold our worship--the pastors, organist, camera person and sound operator / PowerPoint. This limits our numbers even more. Therefore we have determined that, as hard as it is, we will return to the approach we had last year, at the very beginning of COVID. For the next 3 weeks our services will only be online. We will monitor this, based on the restrictions that are in place.

We do hope and pray that this is the short-term response to the present numbers of infections. Lord willing, we will be back to at least our present levels by the beginning of June.

This also means that we will not be holding services of Holy Communion. As we have in the past, we give you the opportunity to book private communion either here or in your home. We could have 2 groups at a time right now, and still be under the threshold numbers. We will book these in 15 minute intervals, following the service on Wednesday, May 12th and from 11:30-12:30 next Sunday. Please call the office to register for this.

It is disheartening for all of us that we have to face these restrictions again. We know how blessed we are by our gathering together in the name of the Lord around His Word. Our fellowship in the Word is such a key part of our lives as the people of God. Yet, as God's faithful, we also obey the laws of the land and seek all that we can do under the circumstances to be in that Word through our online services, and to share it with others who may not have that technology.

We also urge you to pray that God would deliver us from COVID; that He would strengthen us for these days and that He would continue to provide for His church. COVID may create complications, but it cannot keep us from the grace that God gives us in Jesus Christ. Your pastors are here to serve you. Your church is here for you. May God bless us in our mutual ministry together!

The Holy Catholic Church

Q: In the creed, we can confess our faith in the holy catholic church. Are we catholic?

A: Yes, Lutherans are catholics, but not part of the denomination called "Roman Catholic" which many people, including most Roman Catholics, mistakenly call the Catholic Church. Lutherans are catholic because Lutherans confess the Christian faith according to the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds. In the original Greek of the Nicene Creed and the Latin of the Apostles' and Athanasian Creeds, the word "catholic" was used to describe the Church. In the century before Luther, the German word "christliche" (Christian) was used to translate the Latin "catholicam" (catholic) in these creeds. Since older Lutheran hymnals were translated into English from the German rather than the original languages, the term "Christian" was used in these creeds. Today, many Lutherans have returned to using the word in the original: catholic.

The word "catholic" comes from the Greek and is often translated as "universal." St. Iranaeus, Bishop of Lyons in France (a Lutheran before his time), wrote in A.D. 189, "the Church, although scattered in the whole world, carefully preserves it (this faith), as if living in one house." We can see then that the word "catholic" may mean that the Church is universal, not limited by space or time, or the word also may simply be a synonym for "Christian." So "Roman Catholics" are Christians who recognize the bishop of Rome as the head of their Church. "Greek Catholics" are Christians who adhere to the practices and beliefs of the Eastern Orthodox Churches. Lutherans are sometimes referred to as "Evangelical Catholics" because we are Christians who emphasize the centrality of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and faith in Him.

The Augsburg Confession at the end of Article XXI states, "As can be seen, there is nothing here that departs from the Scriptures or the catholic Church or the Church of Rome, insofar as the ancient Church is known to us from its writers." Thus, within our own confession of faith, we are identified as "catholic"; Christians who believe in Jesus as our Saviour.
