"For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known." (1 Corinthians 13:12, ESV)

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus:

It is interesting how it is often the small things that are the most irritating. During these less than joyful COVID days, I have become annoyed with the number of times I have to clean my glasses. I am sure that those of you who wear glasses know what I'm talking about: with the masks, glasses tend to fog up and all that air that we exhale tends to leave a bit of a smudge or whatever on the lenses. It doesn't help that I'm not as young as I used to be, and that my eyesight is changing anyway. I probably am starting to develop cataracts. All of these things make it necessary to clean my glasses and even then, my eyes tire from the extra time with online meetings and activities. Even reading with the mask on can be a challenge as my glasses fog up and I have trouble seeing the page!

That frustration made me think of the words of Paul, who speaks of us looking at life–and, yes, looking at the truth of God–through a mirror dimly. The word for dimly actually means that which is difficult or impossible to understand— 'that which is puzzling, like a riddle. It is a colloquial way of speaking of something that just isn't clearly understood.

Paul had been speaking of love, especially of God's perfect love, and how that is seen in our lives. He also spoke of things that last and things that will pass away. He notes that God has not revealed everything we could know or that could be revealed through ongoing prophecy. God simply calls us to live by faith.

So much of life today seems to be under a fog. We tend to see things "dimly". In our prayers we ask, "how long, O Lord?" How long will this COVID stuff continue? How long until we worship without limitations and restrictions? How long before we get back to the fellowship and sharing together in the ways we once did?

We don't have answers for those questions. To say that "only God knows" is not an overstatement. We can't see as clearly as we wish we could the plans and purposes God has ordained. Yet, Paul does remind us that we *know in part*. We do know all that God has done for us in giving His Son to suffer and die for our sins, and to conquer death and the grave for us in His resurrection! Luther, in his explanation of the 3rd article of the Apostles' Creed tells us that *the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith*. (SC, 3rd Article) He has enlightened us. He's opened our eyes to see clearly. Paul put it this way: "For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." (2 Corinthians 4:6, ESV)

Mission of the Month

As an update, we have made great progress on the church Organ Fund during the past two years.

In late February 2019, the church members, in a special meeting after the church service, voted to proceed with a new organ purchase. The new deluxe organ arrived at the end of summer, built by a company in Ohio. We have been enjoying it ever since.

As of late May, and thanks to FLC members' generosity, there is only about \$20,000 owing on the initial purchase price of more that \$100,000. As many of you will recall, we graciously received a dollar bequest in former members' Will. That gift paid for roughly half of the purchase.

We have been quietly and steadily pushing that dollar amount owing downwards in the past two+ years. We used various fund-raising methods, but mainly "word-ofmouth" and just setting out the need to our church members. These efforts, along with the faithful stewardship and offerings of our members have brought the blessings of roughly \$1,000 per month (\$14,000 in 2020).

Do not hesitate to contact me on this effort.

Our great God has given us the resources to manage this cost effectively. May we continue to use this musical instrument to sing His praises.

STORING UP GOD'S WORD

"I have stored up your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you". Psalm 119:11

Can you finish these rhymes or songs? With actions?

"Pat-a cake, pat-a-cake, baker's man..."

"Itsy bitsy spider....."

"I'm a little teapot...."

Chances are, these are little verses that you learned in your childhood, are now forever in your brain. Many of you remember also the actions that go with the verses - in fact for some of you the actions are what helped you learn the verses. Moms and dads, maybe you do these little verses with your child.

Now let's try these:

"In the beginning God created..." (Genesis 1:1)

"The Lord is my shepherd..." (Psalm 23:1)

"God is..." (1 John 4:16b)

Jesus said, "I am the light..." (John 8:12)

"God so loved the world that He gave..." (John 3:16)

These are simple Bible passages. Some of you can finish these passages because you were taught them at a young age. You heard them and said them repeatedly and they have stuck. Things that we hear and learn when we're young stick with us.

We learn Scripture because it is truth. Jesus says "If you abide in my Word you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:32). The Word of God is grasped by faith. Your child received the gift of faith in Holy Baptism, and that gift is nurtured as you talk to your child about Jesus and His love, as you read simple Bible stories to your child, and as you incorporate faith-language as part of your everyday interactions with your child. You as parents are asked to surround your child with God's Word, and to teach it to him or her.

Bible memorization is often associated with Confirmation. Should we wait that long to hide God's Word in our children's hearts? No! God promises that where His Word goes it will not return empty. Where His Word is, His Holy Spirit is also there, creating and nurturing faith. God's Word is a daily reminder of His love and mercy. When we plant God's Word in our children's memories, we are planting something that cannot be taken away from them – something that they will grow into, and that will help them to grow in faith and love for Jesus. How can we do this?

- Use the "Growing Faith at Home" bulletin inserts (note that our bulletins are available online on our website as well as at worship). A short "verse for the week" is always noted on the second page. Work on that verse together at supper time or before bed so that you all know it. That verse connects to the readings for the week, so it will give you something to talk about as well as to memorize.
- Use a Bible memory verse story book, which pairs Bible accounts with a memory verse to put it into context and assist with learning.
- Learn a Bible song together. Music is a wonderful way to ingrain a text into memory. See Deaconess Miriam for some resources that can help.
- Have young children "fill in the blanks" as they learn key words of the passage.
- Pair actions with words. Use American Sign Language (<u>https://www.signasl.org/</u>) or other actions to emphasize key words in a passage.

God bless you as you hide God's Word in your child's heart!

Evangelism Cont'd...

We put together four grocery hampers and delivered them. One was to a non-church member who had a long quarantine time-line due to COVID restrictions. We also did some grocery shopping trips for members.

In later April, I made a deal with the Co-op grocery store at Brentwood. They had many extra big jugs of a new Heinz vegetable juice. I obtained 18 at a discount and distributed those. I thought the juice, which contained 10 different vegetables, tied in with the soon-to-be vegetable planting/gardening season.

With these hand-offs and front-step visits (and occasionally making special trips), we gratefully and graciously accepted any offering plate \$\$ contributions for Foothills Lutheran Church, as an extra service to our members.

And as always, our great God continues to bless us and keep us during these trying times.

It has been over a year that we have endured the restrictions placed on our congregation in response to the Covid 19 pandemic. Now many of us have been vaccinated and we look forward to the day when the restrictions are eased back and we can return to regular worship at church, a return to active fellowship with our church friends and a return to in-person Bible studies, Sunday School, youth events and VBS.

For the present we must remain vigilant regarding wearing of masks, social distancing and frequent washing of hands/hand sanitizing. Still, we can thank our Lord for keeping us safe during these times and we look forward to the time when we can thank Him for ending this pandemic danger.

The Parish Planning Council continues to function, meeting by ZOOM, to oversee the background planning and work of the congregation. As you read the reports of the various committees, you will see that much work has gone on in spite of Covid 19.

I have been working with Brad Otke on issues that come under the Church Properties Committee. We have met with our insurer for an on-site inspection of the church property. The insurer produced a "Risk Assessment Report" and we are taking steps to correct problems pointed out in the report. As well, we are initiating a review of our insurance needs and coverage. We will be doing some comparison shopping to make sure that our coverage is complete and as economical as possible.

Another subcommittee at work is the Nominations Committee. We are planning to have a Voter's meeting on June 12th at 1:30 pm. Elections will be held for the following positions: President, Elders, and the Chairpersons for Fellowship, Evangelism and Church Properties committees.

Please consider volunteering your time to help on any of our congregational committees in the coming year.

Finally, thank you to our ministerial staff for the great work they have done to keep our church worshipping regularly. As well, I wish to thank our office administrator and our church caretaker for their exemplary service to the congregation.

DESIGNATED FUNDS Update to May 18, 2021

- a. We have received a series of advice MEMOS from the Metrix Group regarding the three designated funds that were included in the Submission documents plus the LS Ministry Fund which we later added to the project.
- b. We have since added Dale Dusterhoft and Lorne Rosenau to the Designated Funds Committee joining Robert Heumann.
- c. We are working on formulating a process document which will outline next steps. To be approved by PPC.
- d. The committee is studying the Metrix Group recommendations in order to fully understand them and the ramifications thereof.
- e. We will develop a list of recommended options for any re-designations of the Restricted Funds.
- f. We will develop the recommended steps required to implement said recommendations.
- g. We will prepare a presentation with our recommendations for PPC approval.

REORDS RETENTION POLICY To May 18, 2021

- a. PPC approved a formal Records Retention Policy.
- b. We have sorted through most of the buckets and boxes stored in the Fellowship Hall and in the lower level.
- c. Twenty-one buckets/boxes were separated for shredding. Thank you to Mark Kihn for dealing with the shredding part.
- d. Next steps include the creation of the process for digitizing the appropriate remaining records. Process to be presented at a future PPC meeting.

Board of Stewardship

Our congregation designated February as Stewardship month and the Board of Stewardship focused our congregation on the importance of stewardship of our time, talents, and treasures. As part of our focus on time and talents, we asked every member to complete a "Time and Talents" survey so we could match the various talents and skills of our members with the volunteer opportunities within the congregation and in the community. We had 33 responses to our time and talents survey which is down about 40% from the previous year. Our church cannot survive without active members who are volunteering their time. We ask each of you to prayerfully consider what your talents are and donate some of your time to our congregation. As soon as our congregation is back to normal operations, we will be looking to assign member talents to the various committees and boards in the church. If you missed filling out a survey in February, do not despair as you can still fill one out any time. They are available from the church office.

Our giving is on a downward trend so far this year. We are running about \$15,000.00 behind last year and the current deficit to our operating budget is about \$51,000.00 and about \$35,000.00 behind our budget. As some of you may know, we chose to run a deficit budget this year and pull money from our savings to pay for operating our church and supporting our mission work. Unless we reverse this trend in giving, this deficit will be significant. The Board of Stewardship asks each of you to prayerfully consider if you can increase your giving this year to help us, at a minimum, meet our offering goal and to get closer to balancing our budget so we don't have to pull as much money out of our savings. The amount we give is a personal decision that we should willingly and cheerfully make out of thankfulness for all He has done for us. In 2: Corinthians 9: 6-10 the Bible says: "Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. ⁷Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. ⁹As it is written: "They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor; their righteousness endures forever." ¹⁰Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness." The Pastor, in his column, has outlined the many different ways in which you can make offerings to the congregation.

We thank each of you for your service to our congregation and look forward to the day we can again worship together with no restrictions and use our time, talents and treasures to further the work of our Lord.

Board of Elders

Thank you to the Elders for their commitment and dedication in carrying out the duties of the Elders during these difficult "Covid days". The Elders are: Gary Anderson, Colin Bablitz, Thomas Benz, Darcy Drysdale, Hans Dueck, Goodluck Nwaerondu, and Lorne Rosenau. The Elders focused their attention, this past year, on two ongoing objectives: i) caring for the spiritual health of the congregation and ii) supporting the Pastors and Deaconess and their families.

The Elders have been cycling through their "Shepherding Lists" since the onset of the Covid pandemic a year and a half ago. We apologise for not contacting some of our active members as often as you might have liked. Hopefully you can appreciate that the Elders would have preferred to have made contact with you face to face during our fellowship time on a Sunday morning rather than making a telephone call to you in the evenings after work. We recognise that the isolation periods, of varying degrees during the pandemic, have been very difficult for some of our members. If you have concerns that you would like to address with your Elder please contact him directly or call the church office and one of the church staff will put you in contact with an Elder. Our primary objective is the spiritual health of our members; however, during these days we are also concerned with your emotional and physical health as well.

Likewise, the Elders have been available to support our Pastors and Deaconess; however, the three of them have remained very strong and active during the past year. The Elders supported the needs of Pastor Eric and Kayla during Covid to ensure Kayla had a safe and healthy pregnancy and delivery of their twins. We continue to support them, as needed, as new parents of Wesley and Wren.

Recently, the Elders began an initiative entitled "Lost Sheep". We are concerned about the spiritual well-being of our past confirmands. If we go back to the year 2000, we realize that those past confirmands are up to 35 years old with professional careers and families of their own. We chose one year, at random, and have endeavoured to make a telephone contact with each member of that particular confirmation class to encourage them to continue their Christian walk with our Lord.

At the present time there are 7 Elders; however, a few of them may be stepping down as their second two year term is ending in June 2021. Ideally, we would like up to 12 Elders on the Board.
