What is an "acolyte"?

An acolyte (A-co-lite) is the person (or persons) who lights the candles before the service. The word acolyte comes from a Greek word meaning "follower." In English, the word acolyte sometimes means "attendant."

Why do we use acolytes in the church?

An acolyte wasn't always just a person who lit candles! According to history, the job of acolyte goes all the way back to around A.D. 251. Acolytes have always served an important role in worship. For centuries, acolytes have attended to the service of God's people by helping the pastor in many different ways. One of these ways is lighting the candles. That's why acolytes wear robes and sit apart from the
