

PLANS FOR OUR FALL CONFIRMATION PROGRAM are underway, as we think of the students who will begin their time of deeper study into the Scriptures and the catechism, to know the blessings God gives us as His people. 12th LCC CONVENTION - JUNE 10-13, 2022 EDMONTON, AB: The date is set and plans for the 2022 Synod Convention are moving forward. The theme for the convention, Stand Firm In The Faith, is based on 1 Corinthians 16:13 and was chosen for our convention that was originally scheduled for 2021 in recognition of the 500th Anniversary of Martin Luther's famous 'Here I Stand' speech at the Diet of Worms in 1521. Although our convention is being held a year later, the same theme has been retained since standing firm in the faith is probably more necessary now than ever as a result of COVID-19 ramifications. GOD HAS BLESSED US IN MANY WAYS. That is true for us as a church, and if we are honest with ourselves, it is true for each of us. Those blessings enable us to serve Him in joy. They provide the means for our faithful stewardship, too.

We hope you will remember that our bills and ministry costs continue in these days. When you are away, please set aside your regular gift for the Lord's Work. Let's stay on top of our budget needs! We've been falling behind this year; let's get back on track, remembering God's faithfulness in first giving to us.

Dear friends in Christ, our Good Shepherd:

I know we all long for 'the good old days', when our lives together in the church were more open, unencumbered by restrictions, masks, distancing and so on. Praise be to God, that by His grace we are seeing a gradual, but evident change, from the separation of the last year and a half.

As we gathered together at the beginning of the stage 3 protocols here in the province of Alberta, we determined that we would show loving care and concern for our members by requiring masks in worship during the month of July. We did this, moved by the words of Holy Scripture: "So if there is any encouragement in Christ, any comfort from love, any participation in the Spirit, any affection and sympathy, complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." (Philippians 2:1–4, ESV)

Now, as we enter the month of August, we feel confident of God's providing care so that we can make the use of masks in worship optional, not mandatory. To that end, beginning today, Sunday, August 1, 2021, you may choose for yourself whether you will or will not mask for worship.

As we gather together we do encourage you to remember that the Scriptures call us again and again to be understanding, patient and supportive of one another. To that end, we will:

- respect and honour the decision of those who choose to wear masks. We
 will not criticize their choices, but trust that they are making this decision
 out of love for others.
- respect and honour the decision of those who choose *not* to wear masks. We will not criticize their choices, but know that they also are acting with the best understanding of our love for one another.
- show sensitivity and concern for those who do have special needs and concerns in these days.

As we make this change, we do remind you that our coffee hour will not resume until the fall (Lord willing). We need time to organize and prepare for this time together, including establishing coffee hosts. With so many things having been set aside, committees are often rebuilding from the beginning. We will need to find volunteers for many of the things we do. Again, we ask for your patience in these days.

Sanitization stations will continue to be available throughout the narthex / foyer, and we do urge continued common sense procedures as we still deal with this disease and its variants.

We will also open the basement doors again, providing access to both levels of the building. Please be patient, though, as we have been out of the habit of doing this for the past 16 months!

St. Paul told the Ephesian Christians: "I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." (Ephesians 4:1–3, ESV) May all we do together as His redeemed people and as brothers and sisters in Christ testify to our love for Him and for one another. May He bless our church and its ministry, as well as binding us together in His loving family.
