Dear Friends in Christ, our living Lord:

"So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom." (Psalm 90:12, ESV)

Back when I was in seminary, one of my courses required us to read a book entitled, *Make Your Illness Count*. It was written by a hospital chaplain who acknowledges that none of us like illness, but that God can work through our illnesses to teach us and to lead us into a closer relationship with Him, as we understand His guiding hand at work in all things in our lives.

With every changing news report about COVID people become more frustrated, disappointed and disillusioned. When is this going to end? Why is this happening? And, of course the big one: where are you in all this, God?

From various things happening in the congregations of our circuit, our region and our synod, it is easy to see how the devil has been using this difficult time for his own evil ends. He is leading and tempting us into the anger, the disappointment and the disregard for one another that makes him so pleased with himself.

Thankfully, we know that even as the devil works, our God is also at work and has delivered us from the devil. That is what got me thinking about that book from seminary, so that we ask, "what will you have us learn, Lord, through all of this?"

I see several ways in which God uses this to teach us:

God is teaching us patience. We all know the plans that we have for our lives, and yet so many of them were / have been put on hold. We have learned to stand in lines that separate us when we can't be crowded in to certain spaces. More than that, I see God teaching us to be patient with one another. We may need patience because of the different ways we feel about COVID and the protocols and the constant changes. We need patience with one another, because it will take time for us to get back into the routine of our work together and time to return to the many things that we now realize we took for granted in the church. God, teach us that patience!

God is teaching us compassion. Compassion leads us to care for the needs of others. It leads us to pray for those who are ill. It moves us to reach out to that person who is isolated or to help someone get their groceries. Compassion leads us to do all that we can to protect the health and well-being of the people around us, the people in our church family, and even the people at the mall. Scripture says: "*Bear one another's burdens, and so ful-fill the law of Christ.*" (Galatians 6:2, ESV) This is our call to compassion.

God is teaching us to trust. So many things have been taken out of our control. We may feel that we are being treated unfairly because of restrictions. Perhaps we wonder what will happen to our job with all the ups and downs of openings and closings. What about those who have been sick, or who truly fear that they are going to contract COVID? We're fearful of vaccines; we are fearful of those who haven't had their vaccinations. We worry about what the church is going to be like if and when all this is over. In all our fears, doubts and uncertainties, we can trust in God. One Scripture passage I keep going back to in these days is from Psalm 46: "Be still, and know that I am God. I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!" The LORD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our fortress. Selah" (Psalm 46:10-11, ESV) We are so blessed because the Lord is with us. We can trust in Him, for He will reveal His purpose and grace among us. We know that He has already worked all things for our good. We know all that is ours through Jesus Christ. That leads us to the confidence Paul expressed: "But we have this treasure in jars of clay, to show that the surpassing power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies." (2 Corinthians 4:7-10, ESV)

It is never easy to make the trials of our life count for something good. It isn't always easy to see God's plans and purposes in the midst of those trials. Yes, Satan is going to work–and work hard. But Satan is beaten. He is defeated because your Saviour went into battle for you. His death and His resurrection declare that we are redeemed; we are blessed; we are the winners.

We may be tired and frustrated and disillusioned. We may wonder what lies ahead. I can't tell you that, but I am sure of this: our God will work to bless us, to teach us and to guide us into the joyful hope that comes as we trust in Him.

President's Report

Over the period with the many Covid restrictions, Brenda Bode faithfully made sure we had a picture and sound for on-line streaming. Thank her when you see her. Thanks go out to the many volunteers who helped to keep our worship on Sundays and Wednesdays to continue – the ushers, the cantors, the Covid committee, members of the altar guild, and our caretaker, Brian Vincent who kept the church clean and disinfected.

Last April the church was inspected by our insurance provider – Ecclesiastical Insurance. They made specific recommendations for changes to ensure the safety of our members. Over the summer work was done on the parking lots and sidewalks to reduce the chance of slipping in the parking lot in winter and tripping on sidewalks going to the SW and W entrances of the church. Soon work will be completed on installing windows on doors to a couple of our Sunday School classrooms and replacing old windows on the student residence. Later in the summer we hope to have repairs done to our siding, some gutters, and roofing issues. All of these repairs will keep our church property in good shape for the future.

On September 1 the PPC is meeting to discuss the future of our preschool Also, recommendations by Metrix (an accounting firm that specializes in non profit organizations such as our church) will be made regarding our Designated funds and our accounting procedures. The Oromo Lutherans have made a request to resume worship services at Foothills. Progress on these items will be brought forward to the next Voter's Meeting – Sunday, September 19th at 12:00 pm.

Lastly, I would like to personally invite many of our members back to worship in person at Foothills. You may wear a mask if you wish to keep safe (many do). You should be able to socially distance as there are many half empty pews. We are singing hymns again! We still have certain protocols in place to protect the worshipers during communion. We are working on other changes made to respect the restrictions that the province has put in place for the safety of all. We all want to get back to the normal we once knew and have gained an appreciation for.

Again, join us in worshiping our God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit and share with us in hearing and reflecting on God's Word.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

School has started again, and our prayer is that your children are settling in well. Sunday School will begin on September 12th, and we look forward to having our children back again in with us. We do, however, recognize the anxiety that our currently rising Covid-19 case numbers may be causing.

Our teachers met on September 2nd, and decided that we would offer both an online Sunday School opening and materials for those who prefer to continue teaching at home, as well as a "one-room" option for those who would like to attend in person. Two teachers will lead class for all ages in one of our larger spaces, rooms 2-3. During this time, openings will be done in the classroom. **To allow our teachers to plan well, we are asking that you let us know by Friday noon if your children will be attending the following Sunday.** This approach will be re-evaluated in October as we look at attendance and determine whether we should divide the children into more classes.

For those of you who plan to continue teaching at home for the time being, a Zoom link will be sent out each week with an invitation to join in a time together at 9:00 on Sunday mornings.

The Board of Christian Education and our Covid Committee have made the decision to follow the Calgary Board of Education guidelines on masking, so teachers and students will be required to mask during Sunday School. Please screen your children for symptoms at home as you would for school and keep them at home if they are not well. We ask that you come in the lower west doors, where sanitizer will be available on your entry.

LADIES BIBLE STUDY

During the past year, both our Tuesday and Wednesday Ladies' studies have been meeting on Zoom for the most part. In the summer our Wednesday study began meeting in person. As with all of our studies we will determine with participants whether they prefer to meet in person or on Zoom, and will organize accordingly.

Our Tuesday evening group meets at 7:30 pm and is looking at a study on Philippians, entitled "JOY".

Our Wednesday afternoon study meets Wednesdays at 1:15 pm for an in-depth study of the readings for the upcoming Sunday.

Both studies are currently meeting on Zoom. New members are always welcome! Please contact Deaconess Miriam for more information or to join us. We started the year believing that Vacation Bible School could be in person for 2021. Pastor Eric and Deaconess Miriam got to work on our home-grown curriculum, "Jesus, Our Good Shepherd", and began contacting prospective volunteers and attendees. When it became apparent that a third wave of Covid-19 was upon us in May, we made the decision to move VBS online once again.

This year, we knew better what to do, and with the help of many willing hearts, hands and voices were able to provide openings, Bible and application lessons as well as crafts at three levels, and music to go with each of five days. The program was based on Psalm 23, with companion Bible Lessons for each section of the Psalm. By the end of the week, if they did their memory work, the children would have memorized the whole of Psalm 23.

Sixty-seven children from 40 families registered and received craft packs. Families used the YouTube videos at times that suited them – some finishing the program in a week, some doing them one day a week through the summer. One parent sent an e-mail: "Loving the flexibility of online videos. We're having fun!"

Thank you to all who helped, and all who supported us with your prayers. We all miss in-person VBS, and God willing we'll be back at it next year!

As your children get older, the time of day you choose to do this sharing might change, but you will notice that the depth of what is shared will increase, and so will your bond of love in Christ!

Faith at Home

Hopefully, most of our members are aware of this program we offer at Foothills. But it much more than a program. It is what God wants for families! God told His people: And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates. (Deuteronomy 6:6-9 - ESV)

As a congregation we are encouraging the families of our congregation to adopt a Faith-at-Home lifestyle, where parents claim their God-given role as primary faith-teachers of their children. There are two sessions offered this month. "My Bible", happens in two parts, with parents presenting Bibles to their children during the services on Sunday, September 12th, with a time together for parents and children after worship. "My Church" will be presented on Sunday, September 25th in the sanctuary during Sunday School.

Please prayerfully consider if you might help us in this regard – we only deliver to between 3 and 5 residences – you have no physical contact with the people as we all wear masks and normally leave the meals on a doorknob or in a pack by the door.

A HUGE thank you to Brian Vincent and his crew of volunteers who clean and sanitize our whole church after services. We are all safe, in part, because of their diligence. Giving by our members is still behind our target for the year as our offerings to date are approximately \$240,000.00 and our target for the end of August to meet our budget is about \$299,000, which leaves us a \$59,000.00 deficit. Summer is our slowest giving months so falling behind was somewhat expected, however, not to this extent. I ask each of our members to prayerfully give what they can to help us meet our budget and reduce this deficit.

We have also seen a deficit of volunteers within our congregation. It appears fatigue from Covid and an absence from regular church life has left many people not volunteering as we did in the past. This is leaving us short people on committees and limits our ability to reach out to the community with our various human care ministries. Again, please prayerfully consider what time you can give back to God out of thankfulness for all that He has given us.

We thank all of you who have faithfully remained committed to the church and we look forward to a return to a more normal church life as the year progresses.
