

LIFELIGHT BIBLE CONTINUES THIS WEEK: Join us as we continue our look at the first part of the Gospel of John in our LifeLight study. We meet Tuesday mornings from 10:00 am - 11:30 am.

SUNDAY SCHOOL: In today's "Waterworks" lesson, we learn about how God provided "Food from Heaven" and water from the rock. God keeps His promise to provide for His people as He daily sends manna (bread) and quail (meat) from heaven for them to gather. Having moved their camp from the wilderness of Sin to Rephidim, the Israelites face a new challenge—no water. Despite His daily food supply, the people doubt God's ability to provide water for them and their livestock. Moses cries out the Lord, who instructs him to strike the rock with his staff. Moses does so and water pours out, providing all that the people need. How does God provide for your daily needs?

- I resolve, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to amend my sinful ways.

Let us find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of our souls and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Read Mark 10:33-37. Obviously, James and John Were not listening to the Words of Jesus that spoke of his suffering and death.

Sometimes we only hear what we want to hear without listening to others, including God. A valuable Christian tradition is to sit in silence and listen for God to speak to us.
