IT SHOULD GO WITHOUT SAYING, BUT IT IS ALWAYS WORTH REPEATING: We see so many needs for prayer in these days. We see the problems that COVID-19 has created for so many people. We know the frustration, the isolation, the fears and uncertainty that fill the hearts of many. We know the disappointments we feel from not being able to do so many of the things together that

have been part of our lives together in this place. God calls us to prayer again and again, He promises to hear and to answer. Paul says: "do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:6–7, ESV) May we bring our needs to the Lord, especially as we see all that COVID has done, for He, and He alone, can truly deliver us from this pandemic.

IN THE REMAINING WEEKS OF EPIPHANY the pastors are going to have a sermon series focusing on the Lord's Prayer.
