HYMN STORIES: Our Father, Who From Heaven Above (LSB 766)

Good hymns have always carried the biblical message of the Saviour and teach the basics of the faith. Luther recognized the importance of having such hymns for the congregation to sing. That is why, early in the Reformation, Martin Luther was intent on providing hymns for congregations to sing. By 1534 Luther had created a paraphrase of the Creed: We All Believe in One True God. (LSB 954) Hymn for the Lord's Supper and for the Ten Commandments followed. It was more than a decade later that he wrote hymns for the Lord's Prayer and for Baptism.

In his hymn on the Lord's Prayer, Luther begins each stanza with the petitions of the prayer from Matthew 6:9-13, followed by a brief explanation of the petition. The final stanza is on the Amen. In singing this hymn, we pray the prayer that our Lord taught us, but we also see that Jesus uses it as a model for our prayers, so that we use the petitions to bring all of our needs before the Lord, who has assured us: "call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me."" (Psalm 50:15, ESV)

OUR COMMUNION PREPARATION

Many of our members have used the cards in the pew racks to help them with their preparation for Holy Communion. We removed the cards and the pencils because of the difficulty of proper sanitization in these days of COVID-19. To help you, we have the questions from the card below, along with the prayers before and after Communion that were in the hymnal. We pray that this will help you prepare your heart as you come to the Lord's Table.

By celebrating Holy Communion, I give witness that:

- I believe that Jesus Christ is my Saviour and Lord.
- I have examined my life in the light of God's Word and have confessed my sinfulness to God.
- I believe that Christ's body and blood are truly present in, with and under the bread and wine.
- I believe that in this Sacrament God gives me the forgiveness of my sins.
- I believe that God the Holy Spirit strengthens my faith and renews my life.
- I resolve, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to amend my sinful ways.

A Prayer before communing:

Dear Savior, at Your gracious invitation we come to Your table to eat and drink Your holy body and blood. Let us find favor in Your eyes to receive this holy Sacrament in faith for the salvation of our souls and to the glory of Your holy name; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Thanksgiving after receiving the Sacrament

Almighty and everlasting God, we thank and praise You for feeding us the lifegiving body and blood of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ. Send us Your Holy Spirit that, having with our mouths received the holy Sacrament, we may by faith obtain and eternally enjoy Your divine grace, the forgiveness of sins, unity with Christ, and life eternal; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
