AT OUR VOTERS' MEETING we adopted the budget for 2022. After much discussion, we arrived at a total budget of \$549,347 and the need for offering receipts of \$431,000. The budget has increased from last year, but we are hopeful that additional income from parking and parsonage rental will be "back to normal". We

believe God empowers us to do great things for the good of His people and for the sake of the Gospel in the world. May He help us to be faithful stewards, even in these sometimes confusing and difficult times. FLC PRESCHOOL: At the January 29th Voter's meeting, a decision was made by the voters for the closure of the preschool. Looking ahead there are several tasks which need to be addressed. Some are small while others are more involved and will require some time. The Board of Christian Education is asking our members to consider assisting with this endeavor. There will be a need for someone to lead in the role of Project Manager as well as individuals to help with the smaller details outlined by the Project Manager. OUR MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE

How do we memorize? For each verse take two minutes every night and say it through twice, together, or once in the morning and once in the evening." Do this as a family at mealtimes. Do it every day of the week. Repetition is important.

This week's verse: 1 Peter 3:15

But in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect.

STEWARDSHIP OF OUR TALENTS: We have each been given gifts and God has asked us to use our gifts in service to Him. In 1 Peter 4:10-11 it says:

"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms. ¹¹ If anyone speaks, they should do so as one who speaks the very words of God. If anyone serves, they should do so with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen."

During the month of February, we have been focusing on Stewardship. This week we are focusing on using our talents and gifts to further God's work in our church and within the community. We each have talents and we should be using them to glorify God out of thankfulness for all He has done for us. Your talents can be used in various ways. Some of us may have talents that can be used within our church. Our church is primarily run by volunteers, and we have a significant shortage of volunteers in most areas of the church. We have pastors and church workers who shepherd us and provide for our spiritual needs; however, many volunteers are required to do the work within our congregation and to further our outreach programs in the community. If you have talents that can be used within our church, then we ask you to volunteer for a role in our congregation that make use of these talents. Some of you may have talents that can be used for outreach to our community, either through our congregation's outreach programs or through other Christian outreach initiatives. There are numerous volunteer opportunities that will allow you to use your talents in service to others outside of our congregation.

To help us make the best use of the talents of our members, we ask that each member of our congregation fill out a time and talents survey to determine what your gifts are, and how you can best use these gifts in service to our Lord. We will use the information from these surveys to match the gifts of our members with the needs of the congregation and to find volunteers for our Christian community initiatives. Our congregation cannot survive without engaged active members who are willing to use their gifts as volunteers. We thank all of you who are currently working or have worked in the past on a committee, board or initiative of our congregation. We also encourage those of you who are not currently volunteering to get involved.

They will be in your mailboxes shortly, emailed to those who are in contact with the church through email, and also available through an online survey service. If none of these work for you, please contact the church office if you require a form and we can make one available for you.

Creative Response

Lent begins on Wednesday, March 6 (Ash Wednesday).

Start to think about how you will observe Lent and Easter this year as a family. Here are some ideas:

- At the beginning of Lent have each family member pick out one day during Lent that will be his or her special day. On their special day each member will be expected to be especially helpful, kind and complimentary to the other members of the family.
- Donate time to serve the needy in your area in some way. If this is not possible, make a donation of food or money to a local organisation helping people in difficult circumstances.
- Ask each family member to be responsible for a prayer before meals for one week of Lent. Encourage them to write a prayer of their own.
- Encourage each member of the family to "give up" something for Lent or for a part of Lent. The sacrifice should be something of value but also reasonable.
- Share a "poverty meal" of one or two basic foods several times during Lent. Talk about how it must feel to have such a small amount of food for every meal.
