

MISSION OF THE MONTH: LUTHERAN CHURCH-CANADA NATIONAL YOUTH GATHERING

The 12th LCC NYG will be July 15-19, 2022, in Winnipeg, and the theme is "IN NOT OF," based on Philippians 3:20. The NYG's mission statement is: "Providing opportunities for Lutheran youth to grow in faith and relationship with others as the body of Christ," which is accomplished by providing opportunities for youth, leaders, and volunteers to join in corporate worship, study God's Word, be equipped through large and small group sessions, reach out to the community through servant events, and engage in fellowship and fun. The Foothills youth group is well provided for; the \$495 registration fee and travel costs have been taken care of through fundraising and donations for all our youth. Lent

Lent is a time when we re-orientate our lives towards

God. We follow Jesus in his journey towards the cross.

PURPLE is the colour for Lent and represents the royalty

of Jesus and the call to turn back to God.

Creative Response

Find a place where you feel close to God (e.g. in the garden, in your room, by the beach.) Spend some time with him there.

Set up a table in your house to reflect on each of these four symbols.

Crucifix: Do you have a crucifix in your home? If not, Lent might be a wonderful time to buy one and place it in a central place. Even a child's drawing of Jesus' death for us can be a powerful, stirring reminder of God's love.

Bowl of Water: A simple bowl of water, in a central place, can be an ongoing reminder of baptism in our lives. Use the bowl to mark one another with the sign of the cross during Lent.

Bowl of Sand: A bowl of sand can remind us of Jesus' forty days of temptation in the desert, and our own call to resist temptation in following Christ.

Bible: Lent is a time to renew our focus on God's Word. The prominent placement of a Bible in our home can represent for us our desire for God's Word in our lives. Use the Bible to read one or more verses for your household each day.
