#### HYMN STORIES: My Song Is Love Unknown

The ladies of the LWML looked at this hymn in their bible study at the LWML meeting. It is a favourite of many, and it is our hymn o the day today.

The haunting melody was written by John Ireland (1879-1962). It takes us in spirit to the solemn events of Good Friday. Ireland wrote it to set to music the poem by Anglican clergyman Samuel Crossman (1625-84). Crossman has a sequence of poems that look at the death of Christ, the Christian life, the last judgement, the resurrection of the body, and heaven. This poem has a very personal tone, showing a close relationship with Christ, who is called "my friend".

To sing this hymn during Lent is to recover an evangelical version of an ancient liturgical tradition of the Reproaches in the Catholic liturgy for Good Friday, in which Jesus addresses His crucifiers. That liturgy, which depicts Jesus contrasting His kindness to the Jews with their ill treatment of Him, is designed to make worshipers feel guilty at their complicity in Christ's death. Crossman, changing Christ's direct address to a third-person meditation, uses the tradition to explore the "love unknown' manifested in Christ on the cross.

The unknown love is that love of Christ, so far beyond description. We often speak of *agape* love to describe God's love. We are not deserving of His love. We sin; we turn from Him. Yet the Sinless One, who "made the lame to run and gave the blind their sight" suffers for us to deliver us and to redeem even His foes.

The hymn also reminds us that Christ set aside His heavenly home to die and to be laid in the tomb that we rightly deserve. As we sing this hymn it declares all that we remember in these Lenten days. It is for me, for my sake that Christ suffered and died. As the hymn says:

Here might I stay and sing, No story so divine! Never was love, dear King, Never was grief like Thine. This is my friend, In whose sweet praise I all my days Could gladly spend!

#### OUR MEMORY VERSE CHALLENGE



## **Creative Response**

In Sunday's Gospel reading we hear that Mary (sister of Martha and Lazarus) anointed Jesus' feet with nard, a very expensive perfume imported all the way from the Himalayas. Nard was used to prepare bodies for burial. By anointing Jesus, Mary was pointing forward to his sufferings and death soon thereafter.

As part of your home devotion times this week, anoint one another's hands or forehead with perfume or oil. Say together this prayer:

(Name) I anoint you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that he may strengthen you in all that you do. Amen.
