

With the approval of the Elders, he will be going to Didsbury on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month to lead Communion services. The Didsbury congregation will join us online once a month and have a lay service with a video sermon on the other Sunday. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we seek to be supportive of the needs of the church at large in these days.

OUR WEDNESDAY EVENING SERVICES will have a special focus in these summer months, as our sermons will focus on the books of the minor prophets. As Pastor Eric noted in his sermon two weeks ago, they are minor, not in terms of their importance, but in terms of their size. We did a similar look at the prison epistles and other epistles of Paul during the early days of COVID. We will begin with Jonah on July 6th. We invite you to join us for this study of God's Word.

TRAVELLING ON THE WEEKENDS? Remember the importance of time in God's house, gathered around His Word. Our midweek service is a great way of being fed with God's life-giving Word.

We also hope you will remember that our bills and ministry costs continue in these days. When you are away, please set aside your regular gift for the Lord's Work. Let's stay on top of our budget needs! We've been falling behind this year; let's get back on track, remembering God's faithfulness in first giving to us.

WHEN ARE WE "BACK TO NORMAL"? Throughout the COVID days, several parts of our worship have been different. One of them is the gathering of offerings. The other is our celebration of Holy Communion.

- ❖ The Elders have determined that our best practice for offerings will be to leave the plates at the back of the church and ask people to leave their envelopes in the plates as they enter or leave the church. With many of our members having switched to online e-transfers or pre-authorized debits, many would not have an offering to put "on the plate" on Sunday. We do encourage your faithful stewardship of gifts, especially as we enter the summer months. The plates will be brought forward during the service, but one will also be available to you, should you forget to leave it as you enter.
- ❖ Beginning the 3rd Sunday in September, we will again commune as tables at the altar. We will also be returning to the Common Cup at that time. You are encouraged to either kneel or stand, as you are comfortable. We will continue to practice the best sanitary conditions, as we always have done. We also remind you to fill out a Communion registration card each time you commune.
- ❖ Things such as greeters each week or the pastors greeting at the door will also wait until September.

Wednesdays will continue as they have. We're getting through all of this. Thanks be to God, for His delivering care!

Even when we are busy we, like mary, need to take time to listen to Jesus.
