Creative Response

Jesus said: Anyone who does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. (Luke 14:27)

This means that we sometimes have to do things that we don't want to do or that are hard. Think of one 'hard thing' you could attempt this week as a follower of Jesus.
