DISCUSS

ACTION RESPONSE

Jesus calls all his followers to 'fish for people'. One way we do so is through prayer – by praying for specific people that don't yet know Jesus, and for specific missionaries and mission activities. Hang a string or a cord between two points in your home and attach small hooks to it. Cut out fish shapes from card or paper and write the name of a person you can pray for. Attach the 'fish' to the hooks and use your 'fishing line' as a visible reminder to pray.
