SUNDAY SCHOOL: This week, we will study "The Proof Room." With the words "Peace be with you" (John 20:19), the risen Lord appears among His disciples gathered in hiding from the Jews. Thomas, who is not among the disciples that evening, doubts their report of Jesus' resurrection. Eight days later, while Thomas and the disciples gather in the locked room, Jesus appears among them once again. Thomas witnesses the physical truth of the resurrection as he touches Christ's wounds. Jesus concludes by telling Thomas and us, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (v. 29).

WHAT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE CONGREGATION?

The President presides at all Voters' meetings and Council meetings. In this role he:

- Submits/Prepares the agenda (the order of business).
- Ensures that all is done decently and in order, in accordance with the constitution and statement of direction.
- Makes sure that all proper resolutions or motions are enacted in the congregation.

The President helps the congregation carry out its work by keeping the business of the church moving in orderly fashion, endeavouring to coordinate the functions, plans, and activities of the congregation in all its parts for the total furtherance of the work of Christ's Kingdom in our midst. He often becomes the 'cheerleader' for the congregation, and encouraging the Boards and leaders of the congregation to fulfill their tasks under God's grace. In the name of the congregation, he is responsible to see, as much as possible, that the work we agree to do is carried out. He also serves as a representative of the congregation in many public settings.

Time: Can vary.

The President arranges and chairs Parish Planning Council (PPC) meetings (approx. 8/yr.) and Voters' meetings (approx. 3-5/yr.), from the perspective of this role and the overall advancing of the congregation's ministry.

Key skills (gifts, talents):

- Ability to understand the overall 'big picture' of ministry, and how it all needs to fit together.
- Communication.

The term of office for President in our congregation is 2 years, with a maximum number of two consecutive terms. After the second term, a one-year break must be taken.
