Family Time in Christ

Looking forward to summer vacation? However you travel and wherever you might be, look for opportunities to connect your family's experiences with God's Word in Scripture. Here are some ideas:

- When you get ready to travel, pray for the same protection that God provided for His people in Scripture, as this prayer from our hymnal notes:
 - "Lord God our Father, You kept Abraham and Sarah in safety throughout the days of their pilgrimage, You led the children of Israel through the midst of the sea, and by a star You led the Wise Men to the infant Jesus. Protect and guide us now in this time as we set out to travel. Make our ways safe and your homecomings joyful, and bring us at last to our heavenly home, where You dwell in glory with Your Son and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen". (*Lutheran Service Book p.287*)
- Are you tenting? Share the account of the children of Israel in the wilderness, and how God brought them safely into their new home. Pray that He will bring you safely back to your home and talk about how He promises also to bring you into the heavenly home He has prepared for you.
- Watch the sunset one evening and stay up to look at the moon and the stars. Read about the fourth day of creation (Genesis 1:14-19) and talk about the purpose of these lights that God has given us. What does light do? Now talk about Jesus, who is the light of the world. How is He our light? Why do we need His light?
- Will you be at the beach? Pay attention to what happens to the sand as the waves come in and go out. What happens to rocks? Read Matthew 7:24-27 and discuss the ways in which building on Christ is like building on the rock.
- When you worship as guests in an unfamiliar church on your travels, talk about family. How can we call a relative part of our family even though you've never met them? Now think about the family of God. What makes the people in this new congregation family even though you've never met them before? Discuss Baptism as the way God joins Himself to us and us to all of His family.

South Alberta Zone Spring Rally on May 27, 2023, hosted by St. Paul Society, Medicine Hat

Under the theme, "Chosen & Elected", based on 1 Peter 1:1-2, seventeen ladies gathered for worship, Bible study, fellowship and good food. Pastor Edel led our Bible study. We also discussed how our present culture no longer supports Christian values and how even those of us who were born in Canada often feel abandoned in our own homeland. In keeping with our theme, "Saamis Immigration Services" was chosen for our community outreach.


