We all are to be students of the Word, that we may know and rejoice in the blessings God gives us as His people. If you believe your child should be in Confirmation, speak to the pastors or Deaconess Miriam.

BLESSED BY GOD, we seek to use those blessings in service to Him and to one another. Our financial stewardship has fallen off a fair bit in the past months. We believe this is complicated by problems that have arisen as a result of email problems outside our control. Summer is always a slow time financially, but we do encourage you to remember the needs of God's church, as we respond in thanksgiving to the gifts He has first given to us.

AS STUDENTS PREPARE TO RETURN TO UNIVERSITY it is a good time to remind you of our Parking Policy for Student Parking. Using some of our spaces for student parking has always been a benefit to students but cannot impede the work we do as a church. We have established the following guidelines:

- A Priority Qualified Student ("PQS") is allowed a parking space at no charge. A PQS is a student attending the University of Calgary who is an active, communicant member of the church. (They attend and commune regularly.)
- A Qualified Student ("QS") is a student that is a member of Foothills Lutheran Church who is not active; however, their parents or grandparents are active as described above. A qualified student will be granted parking privileges at half the public rate (\$200.00 per semester).
- Remaining spaces (there is a limit of 32 available in total) will be rented to those who apply, at a cost of \$400.00 per semester.

A SPECIAL SERMON FOCUS: In Romans 12:6, St Paul wrote: "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them." Putting it simply, God has given each of us the ability to do certain things well. In 1 Corinthians 12:4-7 he added, "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." Our gifts are to be used in building up Kingdom of God.

Later in September, we will have a special sermon series on spiritual gifts. The Greek words for God's Spiritual gifts (*charisma*, *charismata*) stem from the root word, *char*, which means "joy". A basic element of a spiritual gift is that it brings delight, joy and satisfaction when it is exercised. We will focus on these gifts that we may understand our gifts and find the joy that comes from serving the Lord with gladness through the gifts He gives us.
