

TODAY WE BEGIN OUR LOOK AT THE GIFTS OF THE SPIRIT and as we talk about these gifts, we hope you will give special thought to the way that God has blessed you! St. Paul tells us: "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them. (Romans 12:6, ESV) Putting it simply, God has given each of us the ability to do certain things well. In 1 Corinthians 12, he added: "Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good." (1 Corinthians 12:4–7, ESV) The key is that these gifts are given for the common good. Our gifts are to be used in

Using Paul's general outline in Romans 12, we will look at a few chief categories of gifts, so that we may understand how the Holy Spirit works in us and in His church, to build up the body of Christ in this place.

HOLY BAPTISM:

In the Small Catechism, Martin Luther reminds us:

What is Baptism?

Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.

Which is that word of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." (Matt. 28:19). (SC, Baptism 1)

Luther goes on to remind us of what God in His Word says is the blessing of Baptism:

What benefits does Baptism give?

It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Which are these words and promises of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." (Mark 16:16). (SC, Baptism 2)

When Peter spoke of Baptism on the day of Pentecost, he urged the people: "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you and for your children and for all who are far off, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to himself."" (Acts 2:38–39, ESV)

As we celebrate the work of the Holy Spirit today, and as we rejoice in the baptisms this morning, may we remember, with great joy, our own Baptism, and the gift that God has given to us. We encourage you to look at the Catechism, too, to see the wonderful blessing that is Baptism—God's gift of new life by His grace.
