

**FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP:** We have seen a steady decline in our giving from our congregation as the year has progressed which has left us with a deficit of approximately \$65,000.00 below our budget for 2023. We often fall behind during the summer months when attendance is low and make up for it in the fall and winter. As we have fallen substantially behind this year, we ask that everyone prayerfully consider their giving in the upcoming months so that we can continue with the work of the congregation in supporting our members and reaching out to the community in spreading the good news of Christ.

*VACANT PARISH PLANNING COUNCIL POSITIONS:* We currently have vacancies in the following positions on our congregation's Parish Planning Council (PPC). Please prayerfully consider if you have gifts of leadership or service that will fit any of these positions. If you have an interest in discussing these roles further, please contact Dale Dusterhoft – Chair Board of Stewardship, Hans Dueck, Vice President, or Pastor Bode.

- **President:** Our President is a position held by a male member of our congregation who is responsible for coordinating and presiding over meetings of the PPC and the voters of the congregation. He ensures that the various boards work together to carry out the mission and work of the congregation and that the PPC and congregation follows the constitution and by-laws of the congregation.
- Chair Board of Human Care Ministries: The Chair of the Board of Human Care Ministries works to recruit a committee of other church members who coordinate programs within the congregation to provide human care to members of our congregation and in the community that are in need. The committee coordinates our congregation to help our members who may require various needs, and coordinates our congregational efforts with various Christian social agencies that provide for the needy in the community (Food Bank Mustard Seed, Meals on Wheels, etc).
- *Chair Board of Evangelism:* The Chair of the Board of Evangelism works to recruit a committee of other church members who work with the church staff to engage and train the congregation for outreach in the community, in our circle of friends and family and within the congregation.
