CREATIVE RESPONSE

For many centuries the fish has been an important Christian symbol. In the time of the early church, it was dangerous to be known as a Christian in some parts of the Roman Empire; so believers developed a "code language" to reveal their faith to other Christians. A Christian would draw on the ground the upper half of a fish symbol. If the other person was a Christian they would recognise this and add a second curved line to complete the drawing of a fish.

- Make a list of names (perhaps in the shape of a fish!) of people you know who do not know Jesus. Pray for them.
- Go on a "chalk walk" in your local community. Use chalk to draw the fish symbol on footpaths in your neighbourhood. When you do so, pray for the people who work or live nearby, that they may live with faith in Jesus.
- Come up with your own household "code language" to symbolise your faith in Jesus.
- Pray for those who live where it is dangerous to be a Christian.
