Dear friends in Christ, the Lord of Time

As we enter a new calendar year, it is a custom for many to make New Years' resolutions. Those resolutions tend to be things like, "I'm going to watch less television", or "I'm going to get more exercise". Many of the resolutions that people make are fine intentions, but they are often forgotten very quickly as the new year unfolds.

When I think of resolutions, I tend to think of convention resolutions. Over the years I have served on many "resolutions committees" for both district and synodical conventions. The job of the resolutions committee was to look at the things that were submitted to conventions as action items and to determine if they were able to be combined with similar resolutions and then organize them for the convention. These resolutions follow a standard pattern—they began with a rationale, summed up in the whereas statements, and then the action that is to flow, using the phrase, "therefore, be it resolved".

What if we made that kind of a resolution as we look to the new year? I offer this for our consideration:

WHEREAS The God, who created the world through His Almighty Word also upholds all things through that Word (Hebrews

1:2-3); and

WHEREAS our God works all things in accordance with His good and

gracious will for our blessing and salvation; and

WHEREAS God, the Son, our Saviour Jesus has won for us that salva-

tion through His atoning death and His glorious resurrection from the dead, giving us the forgiveness and life that is

ours by His grace; and

WHEREAS this same Lord has promised to be with us in all things and

in each and every moment of our lives; and

WHEREAS the psalmist asks, "What shall I render to the LORD for

all his benefits to me?" (Psalm 116:12, ESV); therefore be

Our Thursday afternoon study meets weekly at 1:30 pm for an in-depth study of the readings for the upcoming Sunday.


Both studies take place in person, with the option of participation online via Zoom. Contact Deaconess Miriam for more information!

FAMILY TIME IN CHRIST – FAMILY PRAYER

One of the great privileges we have as Christians is that of talking to our heavenly Father in prayer. As we are told in the catechism, He "tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear Father" (these words are from the explanation of the introduction to the Lord's Prayer). And parents are given the great privilege of teaching their children to pray.

Our little ones can learn about prayer even before they are able to speak. Pray over your baby as he lies in his crib. Encourage your toddler to fold her hands when you say grace at the table. Teach new speakers to say "Amen" when you pray with them. Use simple prayers repetitively, so that they can learn to say them with you, and, with simple explanations from you, begin to understand what they are saying. Young children will begin with a "thank you" (Dear God, thank you for...) and a "please" (Dear God, please...). As they become accustomed to praying, you can add an "I'm sorry" - teaching them that when we sin, we say "I'm sorry" to God, and that He is always ready to forgive. Discuss with your older child what Jesus has done for them, or things in creation that they especially appreciate, and include an "I praise you for..." sentence in your prayer.

Prayer can be both routine and ad hoc. Certainly, make prayer a daily part of your time together as a family. But also let your children see you turn to your heavenly Father as things arise during the day. A prayer for healing over a scraped knee; a prayer for safety in your travels before the car starts for a trip; a prayer of thanksgiving when good news is received – all help your child to see that prayer really is for all circumstances! Here are some creative ways to encourage your children to pray, taken from the December 2010 edition of *Home Base*, an LCMS ejournal on Christian family life. (Reprinted with permission of LCMS Board of National Mission). Some will be more appropriate for older children, some for younger children. You decide what works for your family!

• Bandage Prayer - Provide a bandaid for each person. Name one person who is experiencing pain, who needs a prayer for God's healing. (Children will be very concrete and name a physical owie; adults can expand on that).

- Christmas Card Prayer Keep your photo Christmas cards this year and take a moment to pray for one of these people each week.
- Christ Among Us Light a candle at your table, reminding all that Jesus is the light of the world, the light that came into the darkness and whom the darkness could not overcome. Pray a prayer of thanksgiving for Jesus and asking him to show you and your family opportunities to let your light so shine before others that they will see Jesus.
- Siren prayer When you hear a siren or pull over for a squad car, an ambulance, or a fire truck, pray aloud for the person that is hurt, scared, sick, or in trouble.
- Map Prayer Spread out a map (local, province, Canada, or world), give each person three Cheerios, and ask all to place their cereal circles on a place where there is a person, event, or place for which they'd like to pray. Do it!
- Newspaper Prayer Take the first section of your newspaper, split it along the spine, handing one sheet to each person gathered. Ask each to skim their page, looking for one item for which prayer is needed and one item for praise or thanksgiving. Then, pray together.

Notes from the Vice President

It is very hard to believe that Christmas is now behind us, and we are looking forward to a very exciting 2024!

One of the very exciting things that will happen is the kitchen renovation that will start in January with a completion date of April. (Yes, there is that much work to be done!)

Thank you to all the members who voted on December 3rd at the special voters meeting.

And a special thank you to our Kitchen Committee Heather Sommers, Brenda Bode, Christine Heumann and Sarah Knudtson.

I am sorry that I do not have too much to report for the last 3 months.

However, we had a lovely PPC & Elders retreat at the Knudtson home on November 25th to have the one of many discussions on what the future direction of FLC looks like.

Also, we are always on the lookout for volunteers for various positions, and we are always thankful for the amount of members that step up to make events happen at FLC. If you feel called to serve on a PPC or Elder board please let myself or one of the pastors know.

I do look forward to sharing more information in the next Foot Print.

Board of Elders

The Elders currently serving you are Ralf Hinterleitner, Brian Kehler, Rob Kaut, Timothy Knudtson, Robert Kubke, Rick Nelson, and Austin Voss. Please feel free to talk with them at any time for support, questions, or concerns.

The last 4 months of 2023 were primarily focused on orientation of new Elders, whereby there are a lot of responsibilities and background information to understand, as well as preparing the budget for 2024.

Regarding the 2024 budget, the Elders have put forth a budget proposal that continues with the 3 main ministry staff (2 Pastors plus Deaconess). While Foothills has faced decreased donation income resulting in a deficit financial position, Foothills is also immensely blessed with large financial reserves. Given this blessing, the Elders feel it is important to maintain our current ministry with continuity in staff numbers for budget purposes, pending efforts to revisit the direction/vision for the congregation.

Also in terms of 2024 budget, rapidly escalating housing costs caused a real dilemma for the Elders. If we were to follow our interpretation of Lutheran Church Canada (LCC) guidelines for Housing Allowance, we would need to increase it from the current \$1800 per month per ministry staff, to \$3300 per month. The Elders struggled to balance off proper support for the staff, vs. what would be reasonable and acceptable to the congregation, while also recognizing that some staff are impacted more than others by the increasing housing costs. The Elders settled on proposing \$2400 per month, a 33% increase, but final decisions will be made at the upcoming Voters Meeting.

Looking ahead, the Elders are hoping at their January meeting to finally get more in depth into Shepherding matters, namely how do we care for God's people at Foothills. From the Constitution, the Elders 'primary responsibility shall be the spiritual health of the whole congregation' and they are to 'concern themselves with the welfare of every individual within the congregation'. The Elders pray for God's guidance in this daunting task, which is also a tremendous blessing.

As we look ahead to 2024, we thank God for the dedicated service of our ministry staff, support staff, and well as so many volunteer servants. And we pray that God would guide Foothills in knowing His future direction for the congregation, and in serving His people each day. May the joy of Christmas continue with you every day. And may God bless you, and strengthen you, to live your faith and share it with those around you.

Treasurer's Report

December was a busy month for our church finances:

SAGE Properties Corp. - 489,755 Shares of Sage Properties Corp were redeemed pursuant to the sale of the Prince of Peaces Harbor and Manor properties. We received \$1.00 per share (\$489,755) on December 6, 2023. We have 130,188 shares remaining and anticipate these will be redeemed later in 2024 once the sale of the school is closed and Sage Properties Corp is wound up.

GICs - Later in December we re-invested our GIC funds into two new GIC's:

- \$495,000 was invested into a one-year cashable GIC at 5.0%
- \$2.5m was invested into a one-year non-cashable GIC at 5.7%

Sage Properties Corp. – We received a notification that on December 20, 2023 the sale of the Prince of Peace school was finalized for a price of \$4,850,000. Sage will be carrying a six-month vendor take back mortgage which will be paid out in June 2024. After that, Sage will have a final Shareholder meeting followed by the redemption of all outstanding shares. At this time, we have no indication of the redemption price.

LeafFilter - The LeafFilter gutter replacement and leaf guard project, which was initially scheduled for January 26, 2024, was moved up to December 28 and 29 2023. It's all done and we have lots of pictures for our Properties records.

Designated Funds Committee – With the upcoming wind up of Sage Properties Corp., the Designated Funds Project will be one step closer to being completed. We are still waiting for legal advice regarding the Mount Calvary funds.

Board of Stewardship

We currently have vacancies in the following positions in our congregation's Parish Planning Council (PPC). Please prayerfully consider if you have gifts of leadership or service that fits any of these positions. President—Our President is a position held by a male member of our congregation that is responsible for coordinating and presiding over meetings of the PPC and the voters of the congregation. He ensures that the various boards work together to carry out the mission and work of the congregation and that the PPC and congregation follows the constitution and by-laws of the congregation.

Chair Board of Human Care Ministries—The Chair of the Board of Human Care Ministries works to recruit a committee of other church members who coordinate programs within the congregation to provide human care to members of our congregation and in the community that are in need. The committee coordinates our congregation to help our members who may require various needs, and coordinates our congregational efforts with various Christian social agencies that provide for the needy in the community (Food Bank, Mustard Seed, Meals on Wheels, etc.)

Chair Board of Evangelism—The Chair of the Board of Evangelism works to recruit a committee of other church members who work with the church staff to engage and train the congregation for outreach in the community, in our circle of friends and family, and within the congregation.

FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

We are starting a new budget year, and although the budget has not yet been formally approved by the congregation yet, our budgeted giving will likely be similar to last year. I encourage all members to give gratefully what they can out of thankfulness of all that God has given to us to support our congregational and outreach ministry in 2024.

Donations of Stock

Do you know that you can donate stocks to the church? Donating stocks is normally a tax advantage for the giver and an easy way to donate to our church. FEBRUARY IS STEWARDSHIP MONTH

Stewardship is about giving of our time, talents and treasures to God out of thankfulness for all He has done for us. The most important thing to be thankful for is the gift of salvation and eternal life given freely to us by our Lord through Christ dying to redeem our sins. There are other gifts as well. We still live in one of the most affluent countries in the world that allows us the freedom to worship our Lord. When we examine our lives, we have many blessings to be thankful for and it is out of this thankfulness that we should cheerfully give back to the Lord of our time, talents, and treasures.

This February, we will be primarily focused on giving back some time to our Lord by volunteering in the congregation. Each of us has talents that God has granted us, and it is our responsibility as Christians to use those talents to further the work of the church in bringing others to Christ. We have the time as the Lord has blessed us with 24 hours of it every day and 8760 hours in a year. If we gave back just one hour a week, we would only be giving back 0.6% of the time we have in a year. There are numerous areas to volunteer in the church. During the month of February, we will be highlighting some of these areas. If it seems overwhelming to volunteer for some committees, start small by volunteering for one off events or for things like coffee service that require service once per month. Please prayerfully consider what talents you have and how you can use these talents to give back to our Lord out of thankfulness for all He has done for us.
