

God Serves His People: Our Lutheran Way of Worship: Introit

Having prepared our hearts, we come into God's presence. In the psalm texts known as the *Introit* (a word that means "entrance" or "beginning"), we enter into the altar area, symbolic of our entrance into God's presence now that we have prepared ourselves. The psalm texts draw our attention to the theme of the day.

After the Introit we sing the *Gloria Patri*, a confession of faith in the Triune God and especially in the divinity of Christ. We also confess that the God of the Old Testament is also the God who has revealed Himself in the New Testament, and is still our God today.

As a psalm text, the Introit is designed to be chanted. Different tones or melodies can be used with each Introit.

From the Introit, we sing the *Kyrie Eleison*—Lord, have mercy! This is the most basic and comprehensive Christian prayer. While Divine Service 1 expands this prayer, the focus is still on the simple petition, which is our greatest need, that need for God's mercy towards us.

CREATIVE RESPONSE

Read Psalm 51.

Consider dividing up the reading as follows:

· Reader 1: verses 1-2;

· Reader 2: verses 3-5;

· Reader 3: verses 6-9;

Reader 4: verses 10-12.

At the end of each section, invite all household members to respond together with these words: "God, create a pure heart in me."



MEALTIME PRAYER

You feed the hungry with grains of wheat. Thank you, Lord, for this food to eat. Amen.



PRAYER

Jesus our Saviour, please draw us close to you. Amen.



ACTION RESPONSE

Plant and water flower seeds in pots with potting soil.

Plan to give the flower pots away as Easter gifts to friends or neighbours as a sign of the new life that has come through the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Write on the pot "John 12:24" and decorate it with Easter symbols.
