

AN UPDATE ON REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP: At the last voters meeting the congregation asked the PPC to gather more information on the mechanism and requirements to sponsor a family from Afghanistan to move to Canada. We discussed working with Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR) as they work with the government and congregations on sponsoring refugees and can provide guidance on what would be required from our congregation.

We had a meeting with CLWR and they have told us that they have a quota for refugee sponsorship from the government and the quota has been reached in 2024. They indicated that we would need to apply to sponsor a family in 2025 and that the application process would start this fall. We will be having further meetings with them in September and should be able to provide more guidance to our congregation after those meetings.

MAILBOX LOCATION CHANGES: You may or may not notice that the location of your mailbox has changed. This was an attempt to tighten up space and make it more user-friendly for those who picked up mail from the bottom row. We do hope that you will check your mailbox—and learn its new location!

STUDENT RESIDENCE SPACE AVAILABLE: At present, we have 3 students in the residence for the fall semester. If you know of someone who will be attending university this fall and would benefit from this economical accommodation, please contact the church office.

AS STUDENTS PREPARE TO RETURN TO UNIVERSITY it is a good time to remind you of our Parking Policy for Student Parking. Using some of our spaces for student parking has always been a benefit to students but cannot impede the work we do as a church. We have established the following guidelines:

- A Priority Qualified Student ("PQS") is allowed a parking space at no charge. A PQS is a student attending the University of Calgary who is an active, communicant member of the church. (They attend and commune regularly.)
- A Qualified Student ("QS") is a student that is a member of Foothills Lutheran Church who is not active; however, their parents or grandparents are active as described above. A qualified student will be granted parking privileges at half the public rate (\$200.00 per semester).
- Remaining spaces (there is a limit of 32 available in total) will be rented to those who apply, at a cost of \$400.00 per semester.

Parking issues and concerns consume a great deal of time and energy. We have to police the lot, and that is also why we ask you to let us know if you are going to be here, even for a short time. Without controls, we cannot provide safety for everyone or even guarantee we have the parking we need for our programs and activities. If you are a student looking for parking in the fall, please contact the office in the very near future.

CREATIVE RESPONSE

Draw or make a suit of armour out of heavy paper or cardboard and include the following pieces: belt, breastplate, shoes, shield, helmet and sword.

(With younger children you can use these items to play a game of "dress-up.").

Throughout the week, read the description of the "armour of God" in Ephesians 6:13-17. Note that this armor is not promoting violence but the "gospel of peace" (v.15).

Be aware of how the Holy One of God protects you with truth, righteousness, peace, faith, salvation, and the Spirit and word of God. Take time to discuss what each part of the armour of God means to you.



ACTION RESPONSE

Ephesians 6:18 states, "At all times, pray by the power of the Spirit. Pray all kinds of prayers. Be watchful, so that you can pray. Always keep on praying for all of God's people".

One of the most important ways we serve others is by praying for them.
