Dear friends in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

I'm sure you are familiar with the expression, "no news is good news". When someone says that, they are seeking to make someone feel less worried when they have not received information about someone or something. The thought is that if something bad had happened, they would have been told about it: "We haven't heard anything from the hospital today, but I suppose no news is good news."

It is true that there is no sense in worrying about things that haven't happened yet. As Jesus tells us: "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble." (Matthew 6:34, ESV) Thinking the worst doesn't mean that the worst has happened or will happen. Of course, we also have to acknowledge that just because we haven't heard something, it doesn't mean that it hasn't happened. No news is exactly that —no news. We shouldn't worry when we haven't heard anything, even as we remember we couldn't change it if we had heard the news, whether good or bad.

Our world longs for good news, but we are more accustomed to the no news, bad news and uncertain news of our world. Thankfully, God gives us some truly good news. Think back to the wonderful message of the angels over Bethlehem: "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:10-11, ESV) Listen to the words of Jesus on the night before His crucifixion: "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."" (John 16:33, ESV) Tie this all together with the words of John the Baptist to his disciples as he points to Jesus: "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29, ESV) and the good news of the angels at the tomb on Easter morning: "Why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen." (Luke 24:5-6, ESV)

Perhaps you have heard of Schrödinger's Cat. This was a thought experiment devised by the Austrian physicist Erwin Schrödinger. The basic idea is that if you seal a cat in a box with something that can eventually kill it, you won't know if the cat is alive or dead until you open the box. So, until you open the box and observe the cat, the cat is simultaneously dead and alive. You can't know what is until it actually happens. In biblical terms, why worry about the unknown? We have something better. We cling to what we do know.

There is a poem by Margaret Clarkson that says:

I do not know what next may come

Across my pilgrim way;

I do not know tomorrow's road,

Nor see beyond today.

But this I know --my SAVIOR knows

The path I cannot see;

And I can trust His wounded hand

To guide and care for me.

There is much more to the poem, but you get the idea. It's not that no news is good news. It is the good news that we have in Christ that sustains and encourages us, no matter what the news may be. We have hope and confidence for our days, through the Saviour who loved us so much that He suffered, died and rose again to take away our sins and give us life. He ascended into heaven to watch over His church and its people in all things. His news is good news for each and every day and in each and every circumstance. VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Our summer VBS, "A Week with Jesus", ran July 22-26 with sixty-nine children attending, including eight Volunteers-in-Training. During VBS we focused on a week in the Bible - Holy Week - where we see just what kind of a King Jesus, our Saviour, is. Every day we sang, learned from the Bible, played games, and did crafts. One-third of the children who attended were unchurched, so it was a great opportunity to introduce them to Jesus, our Saviour.

Each year we collect a daily offering, half of which is sent to a mission. This year we are able to forward \$647.00 to Hope Mission, Calgary, for their children's programs.

We couldn't do VBS each year without the many volunteers who come forward to teach, help in the classroom, and lead activities. Thank you to the 32 people (21 of them youth) who filled these roles. We give thanks to God for you!



Family Time in Christ

Worshipping Together as the Family of God

Have you been to a family reunion lately? hey are wonderful, welcoming, intergenerational events. Our worship together as the people of God is like a regular family reunion. Believers age 0 - 95+ gather together to receive God's gifts of grace, and to respond with thanksgiving and praise. When we bring our children to worship, we teach them that they are indeed part of the family of God. We rejoice that in our congregation we see children being brought to Jesus' feet in the worship service. We know that it takes commitment and consistency on the part of parents, and those who help them, to bring children into the rhythm of our worship. More importantly, we know also that you are laying a foundation for their future life in the Church. God bless you! Here are some tips for worshipping with children from those who have gone before you:

Give quick reminders of where you are going. Remind them that they are coming to God's house, and that they will be there together with God's family. Talk about the people they will see, and what will happen at Church.

Point out important parts of the service to your children as they happen — This helps keep them focused on why they are there and helps them understand what is going on. Practice simple parts of the liturgy at home and give them notice when a part that they know is coming up in the service.

Point out the items they can see in the Church – Notice banners, candles, altar, cross, etc. and talk about what they tell us.

Introduce your children to people – Let them meet the ushers, those who are sitting around you, the Pastor, the musicians. Your children are important to all of us!

Bring quiet toys and books or grab a busy bag from the back of the Church — Soft photo albums, short books, or a special soft toy can help during those times when a child gets wiggly.

Take a walk if you need to - Use the narthex or the nursery to settle your child or give him or her a short wiggle break if necessary, but bring them back to worship so they don't get too attached there!

Remember that kids will be kids —If they (or you) have a bad morning, don't let that keep you from coming next week. God loves your children, and so do we!

Ask for help if you need it – There are many people in our congregation who are willing to be an extra lap or set of hands during worship. Check in with Deaconess Miriam if you want to be introduced to some of them.

Board of Stewardship

Financial Stewardship: As normal, our giving has fallen off during the summer as many of our members are away. We are about \$20,000 behind our budget so I encourage all members to prayerfully consider increasing their giving during for the rest of the year so we can meet our budget obligations.

Volunteers: A big thank you to all our volunteers who participated in our Vacation Bible School, providing food for the funerals we have had, the kitchen renovation project and the other projects and initiatives we have had this summer. We cannot do it without you so Thank You! As we enter the fall, we encourage all members to see where they can help in our church. You will find volunteering in our congregation to be a great way to meet others while giving back to our Lord out of thankfulness out of all he has given to us.

Update on Refugee Sponsorship: At the last voters meeting the congregation asked the PPC to gather more information on what would be the mechanism and requirements to sponsor a family from Afghanistan to come to move to Canada. We discussed working with Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR) as they work with the government and congregations on sponsoring refugees and can provide guidance on what would be required from our congregation. We had a meeting with CLWR and they have told us that they have a quota for refugee sponsorship from the government and the quota has been reached in 2024. They indicated that we would need to apply to sponsor a family in 2025 and that the application process would start this fall. We will be having further meetings with them in September and should be able to provide more guidance to our congregation after those meetings.
