Our Lutheran Worship: Sanctus

The Proper Preface ends with joyful assurance: "Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven we laud and magnify Your glorious name, evermore praising You and saying", and then we join in the words heard by the prophet Isaiah as he was given a vision of the throne of God. The seraphim, high-ranking angels that stand in the presence of God, sing the Sanctus: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory!" (Isaiah 6:3, ESV) The evangelist John's vision of heaven confirms what Isaiah saw. The "living creatures"—the seraphim—sing "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!" (Revelation 4:8, ESV) What a joy to join the whole host of heaven, including all the saints of all generations, in the praise of the God of our salvation.

The Sanctus also includes our call for God's help. "Hosanna" means "help us" or "save us.' The crowds sang these words as Jesus entered into Jerusalem in preparation for His death. The Sanctus leads us as we prepare to receive Jesus who comes to us in His body and blood. "*Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD!*" (Psalm 118:26, ESV)
