

MISSION OF THE MONTH: REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP

Motivated by Christ's love, we seek to being helping and caring to those in need. One way to do this is to "welcome the stranger" (Romans 12:13). As we have in the past, we are seeking to show this love for others through our Refugee Sponsorship. We will be working with Canadian Lutheran World Relief to accomplish this. Your prayers and your support for these efforts are Christ's love in action for a hurting world.

To put faces to our efforts: Qadir and Bahishta attend worship faithfully here at Foothills. Their family, a family of four, fleeing Taliban persecution in Afghanistan, has been hiding in Pakistan since August 2021. They escaped after being tortured and beaten by the Taliban for several days and now live in constant fear of being deported back, where they face certain death. Despite severe illness, they cannot seek medical help due to the risk of exposure. This family urgently needs our support to survive in hiding. Your gift will help us get closer to our goal.

MINISTRY APPRECIATION PIE SOCIAL: Although ministry Staff love what they do as they are answering God's call for them to serve his people, being a member of the Ministry Staff can be challenging as well. There are so many ways to show our

CREATIVE RESPONSE

Read Mark 10:33-37. Obviously, James and John were not listening to the words of Jesus that spoke of his suffering and death. Sometimes we only hear what we want to hear without listening to others, including God. A valuable Christian tradition is to sit in silence and listen for God to speak to us.

Take time this week to sit in silence and listen for how God wants to speak to you. Use the words from Mark 10:45 ("He came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many") to read slowly, quietly and thoughtfully during this time.



ACTION RESPONSE

The very best way to learn the value of service is to do it! Here are some ideas to serve as a family this week:

- Engage your children in serving others together with you, whether inside or outside the home (eg; weed a garden, bake biscuits, visit an elderly neighbour)
- Look at the talents of the people in your family and help them to find ways to use these gifts to serve others
- Take advantage of service opportunities offered through your church, school or local community
- Talk with each other about experiences of serving and being served. Draw connections between your faith and your actions.
- Help each other know how Christ serves us, and calls us, in turn to serve others.
