**THE BLESSED SEASON OF ADVENT** helps us prepare to celebrate the Saviour's birth—second in importance only to His resurrection on Easter Sunday. There are various traditions that help us in our Advent journey:

- The altar colour is blue, which symbolizes anticipation and hope in our coming King. Violet/purple are also used as a symbol of repentance in preparation for this King.
- We do not sing the Gloria in Excelsis during Advent. This is the angel's Christmas anthem of praise, and so we pass over this hymn in silent contemplation.
- The Advent wreath is used, with the four candles—one for each Sunday in Advent. As the candles are lit each week, our anticipation grows as we look forward to Jesus' coming among us.

There are other traditions, but the focus is always this: Christ is coming! Let's get ready! We have reason for great rejoicing in His appearing!
