Dear Friends in Christ:

I am living in my "last days". Please note the quotes that are meant to be informative and ironic. I'm not dying. I'm not leaving Calgary at this time. In the sense that we are all living in our last days, that is true for me, just as it is for you. But I have had to face that reality of "last days" many times in the last few weeks. I have attended my last Sunday School teachers' meeting as the pastor of Foothills. I attended my last Board of Education meeting. This is my last pastoral letter for our newsletter. Soon I will teach the last of Bible studies as pastor and preach my last sermon as pastor. Each "last" has come with its own grim reality. Soon I will not be doing so many of the things that have been such an important part of my life for more than 42 years. While I know that there will be opportunities to teach, to preach, to visit and so on–perhaps even in this congregation–the truth is that I won't be doing it as the *pastor* of this congregation.

For the best part of 14 years, it has been my joy, my privilege and a blessing to be able to share God's love with the people of this congregation. As I look back over the years, I do it with a great deal of fondness. Things have not always been perfect. We have had our struggles, our disagreements and our losses. Thankfully we found the ability to forgive the hurts and errors, and the strength to work together to the glory of God. There have been changes, both for good and some not so good. Yet it has truly been a joy and blessing to serve the people of this church as pastor and shepherd. I have been loved, supported, cared for and encouraged by your prayers, your presence in worship, your involvement in the mission and ministry we did together.

In my January Voters' Report, I noted that there are changes coming in the life of our congregation. That is why we are so blessed to know that in all the changing scenes of life we live under the care of the Lord of the Church. I think of the words that God spoke to His people through the prophet Jeremiah: "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." (Jeremiah 29:11, ESV) As you look to

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the future, look to the Lord who has called you as His own. FOOTHILLS DIRECTIONAL COMMITTEE

The Foothills Directional Committee has received lots of input from the congregation on the long-term direction and initiatives we should be pursuing as a congregation. The committee has distilled this input into five key areas that the congregation should pursue over the next three to five years.

- Improve connections within our membership: Focus on connecting our members with each other outside of Sunday service. Focus on small group ministry, activities outside of Sunday worship, visitations and supporting each other.
- Increase involvement, engagement, and volunteerism. Looking at the way we communicate volunteer opportunities, recruit and structure volunteer roles. More focus on short term volunteer roles.
- Support church membership to be more visitor friendly. Re-initiate greeters before service, wearing of name tags, reaching out to visitors after service.
- Relevant meaningful worship services. The congregation likes the variety of worship services we offer, however expressed an interest in the services being relative, primarily through the liturgy and music.
- Community Outreach. Focus on outreach initiatives in our immediate community.

Next Steps

The committee will now develop specific goals that align with the focus areas above that we will present to the congregation for adoption in the May/June time frame.

March Mission of the Month Refugee Sponsorship

As we look to support a family from Afghanistan, we will need financial support for this. We pray that our members will show love and hospitality through their support of this project.

During the past couple of months the Elders have been working with the ministerial staff as they transition from 3 to 2 staff; additionally as we go from 2 pastors to 1 as a result of Pastor Bode's retirement on Sunday March 2. There will undoubtedly be some changes to the existing programs and classes. More volunteers will be necessary to help maintain some of these activities.

The Wednesday night worship service will be reduced to being offered only on the Wednesday following a Sunday that did not celebrate Holy Communion. Sunday morning education classes will require more volunteers to sustain the minimum that is offered presently. Pastor Eric and Deaconess Miriam must maintain the teaching of the confirmation classes. Volunteers will be needed to help teach the Youth and Young Adult class as well as the Adult Bible study. Pastor Eric would also like to continue to be involved in each of these classes as time permits. The monthly Men's Saturday morning Bible Study requires a volunteer to take the lead in order to maintain this program. The Board of Christian Education is working on training opportunities to help our volunteer teachers be comfortable and confident in their roles.

It will be important to continue our hospital and shut-in visitations through this transition time. Pastor Eric would like to involve more volunteers to assist with this task as we keep in touch with our Foothills family. If you would like to be involved in this area, please contact him.

This is a very exciting time for all of us at Foothills. We are in the process of establishing a new vision or direction for the future of our church. Now is the time for all of us to get involved in getting our new direction rolling. If you are presently active in our congregation, you might wish to change roles, but please continue to give of your time and talents. With many new volunteer opportunities in the near future, we encourage you to prayerfully consider helping out using the gifts we have all been blessed with.

Family Time In Christ

The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 5th. During these 40 days Christians take time to prepare for the celebration of Jesus' resurrection by focusing on our need to repent of our sins and our need for a Saviour from sin. There are a number of Lenten traditions that can be incorporated into your regular family time together.

Ashes on Ash Wednesday: From Biblical times, putting ashes on one's head has been a sign of repentance – recognition of one's sin and a desire to turn away from it (Jonah 3:6; Matthew 11:21). If you are coming to church on Ash Wednesday, you and your family will have the opportunity to receive ashes on your forehead, made in the sign of a cross to help you to remember that your sins were paid for by Jesus on the cross. If you are not able to come to church, take some time on March 5th to make some ashes. During your family devotion time, mom or dad can put ashes on your children's foreheads in the sign of a cross. Explain to them that at the beginning of this 40 -day journey through Lent, you are remembering the reason why Jesus came. You are remembering that He came to die for our sin!

Lenten Centerpiece: This idea is very similar to the advent wreath. Make a cross-shaped centerpiece with eight candleholders, with a candle for each week in Lent. You might tie a purple ribbon at the centre of the cross. This centerpiece will visually remind your family of its progress through Lent, keeping the family focused on its preparation for Christ's resurrection at Easter. Finish by tying a purple ribbon where the two pieces of wood cross. Another nice touch is to place a purple tablecloth on the table to correspond with the liturgical colors in the Church. Beginning on March 5th, light all 8 candles at your family devotion time. On March 12th light only 7 candles, and light one less candle each Wednesday until on April 16th you have only two candles left. On April 17th light only one candle, and on April 18th – Good Friday - as you remember the day that Jesus took the full measure of God's punishment for sin and died in our place, light no candles. On Easter Sunday, light all the candles again, and celebrate Jesus' Resurrection!

Read Scripture Together: This season is a good time to read the Gospel accounts of Christ's Passion (Matthew 26:1-27:66; Mark 14:1-15:47; Luke 22:1-23:56; John 18:1 -19:42). Choose one account and read it through Lent, discussing any questions your children have. For younger children, use a Children's Bible.

Visit the Sick: If you don't have an elderly family member nearby, find out if there is someone in the church who is homebound or in a nursing home and adopt an elderly person as a grandparent. Make a family commitment to keep up your visits and encourage this person throughout the year. During visits you can share photos, play cards or board games, or just talk. Pray for this person regularly.

Family Fasting: Fasting doesn't need to mean giving up food. It could mean giving up a computer game or a weekly television show. Use that time for Scripture reading, family prayer, or a family service project.

Sing Together: Bring a hymnal home and make a point of singing a Lenten hymn together. Singing before, during or after any family prayer time is a good reminder that Lent is passing and the time for rejoicing is nearer than the day before.

Palm Sunday: If you receive palms at the worship service, bring them home and place them behind a cross or a picture of Jesus. Let them dry and then use them next year to make ashes for Ash Wednesday.





THE TIME OF LENT

Begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with midday prayer on Holy Saturday.

The Time of Easter invites us into the story of Jesus' sacrificial death and His glorious resurrection. The resur-



rection of Jesus gives proof that our salvation has been completed and that our hope for eternal life with God is secure.

Easter was the major celebration of the Early Church, which also set aside a period of preparation to celebrate the Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord (Easter). Lent was a period of preparation first prescribed for baptismal candidates. During this period, the candidates were examined in preparation for Baptism at the Easter (or Paschal) Vigil. Later, these forty days were associated with Jesus' forty days in the desert prior to His temptation (Matthew 4:1-11) and with the forty years the children of Israel spent in the wilderness (Numbers 14:34), becoming a period of preparation for every Christian.

The Sundays during this season are not "of Lent" but "in Lent." Thus the Sundays retain an Easter tone and may be less solemn than the midweek services that congregations typically offer. The observanc-

es of Lent are concrete reminders of the greater solemnity of this season, yet Lutherans emphasize the Gospel of Christ as central even to this penitential season.

In Lent, we prepare our hearts to receive our crucified and risen Lord.

LENT PRACTICES AND TRADITIONS

The church is decorated in violet, the color of royalty and repentance. This period of repentance is marked by a purposeful turning away from our sin and turning toward Christ for His mercy and forgiveness.

Ash Wednesday begins the observance of Lent. Ashes on the forehead is a sign of penitence and a reminder that we, too, shall die and therefore need forgiveness from Jesus. Black may be used to decorate the church on Ash Wednesday.

Alleluia is the Hebrew word for "Praise the Lord." It is a joyous expression of faith in God. During Lent, we forego using this joyous response in order to focus on our need for repentance and faith.

As in Advent, so in Lent, we do not sing the Gloria in Excelsis in the Divine Service. We do this to focus our worship on repentance.

Fasting is giving up eating at a particular meal or time in order to devote that time to prayer and meditation on the Word of God.

Many churches observe Lent by gathering for midweek services. These additional times of worship and gathering around God's Word help us prepare to observe Holy Week and celebrate Easter.
