The following are some transition updates, and requests, for you to be aware of, further to the March 21 Letter to the Congregation:

Worship During Vacancy – All Worship Services, whether Pastor or Elder led, will be prepared by our Vacancy Pastor Bode or a guest pastor. There will continue to be a mix of traditional and contemporary music. Sermons will be written by Pastor Bode or a guest pastor. Regardless of who leads, we will hear God's Word and sing His praises.

Calling a New Pastor – A Call Committee has been established, consisting of Austin Voss (Elder, chair), Stacey Bablitz, Tim Knudtson, Robb McLean, Tobi Stene, and John Voss. Their primary role is to gather information:

- a) Call documents information on the congregation, to be given to a called pastor.
- b) Congregation input gifts (skillsets, characteristics) desired in a pastor, as well as names of possible Pastors to call.
- c) Liaise with Regional Pastor Mohns to provide him with gifts desired in a pastor, and obtain information on candidates.

The call process includes a pre-call meeting, where all can attend to better understand the call process, review the congregation's situation, and review the gifts desired in a pastor. Once the list of candidates is narrowed down, information on each candidate will be provided to the congregation, and a call meeting will be held at which the voters will prayerfully select a pastor to call. And then the called pastor prayerfully considers the call and may come for a visit. The call process does take time, many months – only God knows.

Help During Vacancy (and Onwards) — It is important both now, and for the future, that more people are energized to serve the Lord in volunteer roles. Serving is an excellent opportunity to grow in faith. More people serving helps our ministry, to God's glory, and shows possible pastors that we have passionate people for the ministry. Where you see a need, or if someone approaches you, please prayerfully consider filling vacant and needed growth roles.

Don't just say 'I wish someone was doing that', rather pray 'Am I gifted to serve in that role', and have a further discussion with a leader about the role.

Hurting During Vacancy — Unfortunately, during a time of transition, some people can have hurts that they have a hard time overcoming, and they may fall away. Please put in extra effort to look out for hurting people; call them and reach out to be a listening ear and prayer help. Or if you are hurting, please don't just hurt, reach out to a leader, or to the person in the pew beside you, and pray. Sometimes transition hurts come from not understanding, so please don't just bottle up your hurts. Reach out, ask questions.

Be Kind – This time of transition is also hard on our staff and volunteer leaders, who are a vital part of our ministry for God. Please encourage them, and pray for them, so they can joyfully continue serving our Lord. During the transition and vacancy, there are many 'behind the scenes' activities that are constantly being worked on. Please be caring, patient, listen with open ears and heart, and express your opinions respectfully (avoid judging). Let us all seek to show Christian love to one another.

If you are willing to volunteer in any role, please talk with the applicable Board Director (Trevor Heumann – Education and Young People, Heather Sommers – Fellowship, Christine Heumann – Human Care) or leader noted below. If you don't know who to talk to, or if you are hurting, or if you have questions or concerns during the transition, please talk with Deaconess Miriam, or any of the Elders (Rob Kaut, Robert Kubke, Rick Nelson, Kellen Rosenau, Lorne Rosenau, Austin Voss), or Dale Dusterhoft – President, or Ralf Hinterleitner – Vice President.

Praying that during this time of transition, God will continue Easter joy in your heart, and that He will rally His people at Foothills in serving, caring, and loving.

## A Letter from the Pastor

"I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you. Yet a little while and the world will see me no more, but you will see me. Because I live, you also will live." John 14:18–19, ESV

Dear Friends in Christ:

I'll be back.

That line has become very familiar to people, especially anyone familiar with the Terminator movies starring Arnold Schwarzenegger. That quote was placed at No. 37 on the American Film Institute list AFI's 100 Years... 100 Movie Quotes list. Schwarzenegger used the line in some way, shape or form in the other Terminator movies and even in other productions. Others have imitated it, and the line is often used in an ironic sense. One of my favourite (and this is a real "pastor" joke) comes from comedian Colin Mochrie, who said, "Arnold Schwarzenegger announced that he will be playing the role of an 18<sup>th</sup> century Baroque composer in a new movie. Said Schwarzenegger, 'I'll be Bach'".

I'll be back. That was the promise that our dear Saviour gave to His disciples before His crucifixion. Jesus told the disciples at various times that He would suffer at the hands of the religious leaders and that he would be killed. He also made it clear that He would rise again on the third day. "A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me." (John 16:16, ESV) I'll be back, the Lord promised His people.

In the coming days we will sing with joy and thanksgiving as we rejoice in the glorious hope that is ours through the resurrection of Jesus Christ:

I know that my Redeemer lives; What comfort this sweet sentence gives!

He lives, He lives, who once was dead; He lives, my everliving Head. (LSB 461, st. 1)

The Lord of life is ris'n this day; Bring flow'rs of song to strew His way;

Let all the world rejoice and say: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia! (LSB 475, st. 2)

Awake, my heart, with gladness, See what today is done; Now, after gloom and sadness, Comes forth the glorious sun. My Savior there was laid Where our bed must be made When to the realms of light Our spirit wings its flight. (LSB 467, st. 1)

I am content! My Jesus is my head; His member I shall be. He bowed His head when on the cross He died With cries of agony.

Now death is brought into subjection For me by Jesus' resurrection.

I am content! I am content! (LSB 468, st. 2)

We could continue to go on and on. The Lord said, "I'll be back", and He is as good as His Word. He gave His life in our place on the cross, paying the price for all of our sins. But death could not hold Him. On the third day He rose as victor over sin, death and the devil. He lives as perfect proof of the redemption He has accomplished for us. We also know that He will be back to take us to our final home with Him in glory. On the mount of ascension the angel promised, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into heaven? This Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven." (Acts 1:11, ESV)

More than a movie line, this is a glorious promise for us. Our Lord did come back from the grave. He is coming back again to bring us home. Thankfully, we don't have to just wait for Him to come back. The Lord is with us day by day, to help, to forgive, to comfort and to defend us. This, my dear people, loved by God, is your sure and certain hope. Alleluia! He is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

## The President's Report

Call for Volunteers! Our elections are upcoming in June and we have a number of positions that we need to fill on our parish planning council and Elders. A list of the positions we will be electing is below, along with a description of each position. I ask each of our members to prayerfully consider whether your gifts and talents can be used to help our congregation out of thankfulness for all that God has given you. If you have any questions or would like to let your name stand for any of these positions, please contact a member of our nominating committee. Dale Dusterhoft, Ralf Hinterleitner or Deaconess Miriam.

In service to our Lord,

**Vice President** (2 year term to be fulfilled by a man from the congregation)

The Vice President shall, in the absence of the President, act for the President if he is unavailable for short or long periods of time. He shall be available for whatever duties the President shall assign to him as his representative.

Normally, this is a short-term, "fill-in" responsibility. The congregation is blessed through the extra wisdom and guidance of the Vice President.

It may be that you will help the President in the following areas (again, short term). The President presides at all Voters' meetings and Council meetings. In this role he:

- Submits/Prepares the agenda (the order of business).
- Ensures that all is done decently and in order, in accordance with the Constitution and Statement of Direction.
- Makes sure that all proper resolutions or motions are enacted in the congregation.
- Keeps the business of the congregation moving in an orderly fashion and coordinates the cooperation of the various boards through regular Parish planning council meetings

Key skills (gifts, talents):

- Ability to understand the overall 'big picture' of ministry, and how it all needs to fit together.
- Communication

Time: Can vary.

Elders (2 year term to be filled by men from our congregation).

The Elders serve as spiritual leaders within the congregation. Along with the pastor, they are to do all they can for the spiritual welfare of our members. They are to be examples of Christian love and conduct. They work with the pastors and other staff, and support them in their work. They are to be men of prayer, offering that prayer for the called workers and for the members of the church.

In their role as spiritual leaders, the Elders assist in worship (distribution of Holy Communion, for example) as needed. They are also to ensure that the services of God's house are provided in a timely fashion, and that the services are done decently and in order. They see that the Word is brought to people each week, either by being involved in the call process with the congregation, or by arranging substitute pastors or preachers as needed. In some cases, the Elders may lead worship in the absence of a pastor.

As they care for the members, the Elders will:

- Encourage the members, through visitation and discussion, to be spiritual and faithful in worship.
- Render counsel and advice in difficult problems.
- Encourage members, especially new members, to be connected with one another.

#### Key skills:

- An example of Christian love and conduct (regarded as a dedicated Christian).
- Caring, supportive, encouraging Able to encourage church workers in their duties, and able to encourage congregants in Christian growth.
- Able and willing to visit with people.

Time: 4 to 6 hrs per month.

#### **Board of Church Properties** (2 year term)

The basic objectives of this Board are to properly maintain and repair church property, and to generally protect the congregation against loss or damage of whatever nature. It is not the responsibility of the Director to do the work, but to see that it is done. It does help if the individual fulfilling this role is somewhat handy themselves but this is not a requirement. The Director recruits members to help with these responsibilities. This person performs an annual inventory and inspection of the property. Custodial care, insurance and security of the building also fall under this Board.

In many ways, this is the most "hands on" or physical aspect of our ministry. It involves things we can see and use. Much like running our own homes, we want to be sure that the House of the Lord is properly maintained, and kept in an inviting, neat and attractive state. We also want to be sure that the equipment of the church is operating properly. There may also be special building projects/repair projects which need oversight.

Again, we have been blessed by those who have served in this way. They have given a great deal of time and sweat to the maintenance of the church. While we do hope and pray that all our members will show care for God's house, are you that person who can help lead us in this way?

Key skills (gifts, talents):

• An understanding of maintenance matters. (Does not need to be able to do plumbing, electrical, painting, construction, etc., but needs to be able to understand and talk with people about these.); Organized. Ability to oversee projects.

Time commitment: 4-6 hours per month on average. Time may increase when there are special projects.

#### **Board of Evangelism**

The Board of Evangelism encourages the congregation in its concern for those who are not yet disciples at Foothills, beginning with those who may have already connected with us in some way. As with all our Boards, it is hoped that we will recruit others to aid in these responsibilities.

Areas of responsibility include:

- Encourage members to reach out to others with the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to encourage education and equipping in this regard.
- Arrange information for prospective members.
- Work with our website host, to increase our visibility, and arrange advertising as appropriate.
- Work with our ministry staff on any outreach initiatives we may have.

The Director recruits a team to help with our outreach initiatives, prepares an annual budget and approves Board expenses. They also participate in Parish Planning Council (PPC) meetings (approx. 5/yr) and Voter's meetings (approx. 3-5/yr), from the perspective of this role and the overall advancing of the congregation's ministry.

If you have a heart for the Gospel, and the desire to reach out to the lost and dying world around us, this may be exactly where God is calling you to serve.

Time commitment: 4-6 hours per month on average. May increase if a special outreach project is initiated.

#### **Board of Stewardship**

Everything we have is a gift from God. Yet we often don't recognize either His ownership, or our responsibility to use all He has entrusted–normally described as stewardship of our time, talents, and treasures–to His glory.

The Board of Stewardship seeks to encourage people to live their faith as faithful stewards, and to encourage faithful stewardship of God's gifts as a congregation.

As with all our Boards, it is hoped that we will recruit others to aid in these responsibilities.

The Board of Stewardship arranges for an annual "Time, Talent, Treasure" survey. This may be done in various ways, but seeks to encourage our members to think of themselves as stewards. The Board may also provide stewardship education, which can include articles in our Footprint newsletters and Spiritual Gifts training workshops.

The Board of Stewardship also looks at the ways that we, as a congregation, can support work outside our congregation, as we use what God gives for the good of others, too.

The Director prepares an annual budget and approves Board expenses. They also participate in Parish Planning Council (PPC) meetings (approx. 5/yr) and Voter's meetings (approx. 3-5/yr), from the perspective of this role and the overall advancing of the congregation's ministry.

Recognizing what God has done for us allows us to respond in love to His goodness. That is one of the greatest parts of stewardship. Is this one way you can be a good steward?

Time commitment: 2-4 hours per month on average.

#### Treasurer

While most of the day-to-day responsibilities for the financial management of our congregation are completed by our accountant, the Treasurer is charged with the oversight of the congregation's finances, and works to see that we make the best use of our treasures.

A financial ability is a definite asset, but the Treasurer does not need to be trained as an accountant.

The Treasurer reports on the financial health of the congregation to both the PPC and Voters, using the reports prepared by the accountant. They are responsible for seeing that we practice good financial controls, that the books are audited, and that the information we share with the congregation is accurate. While the financial secretary issues receipts, the Treasurer ensures that everything is recorded accurately. They also assure that the accountant files the annual report to Revenue Canada.

The Treasurer coordinates the flow of monies from the Treasury to the various Boards in such a way that an adequate balance is retained for the payment of salaries and other recurring expenses and is one of the designated signatories. (All cheques must be signed by two signing officers of the congregation.

The Treasurer sits on the three person investment committee and ensures that the churches financial gifts are invested in accordance with the churches investment policies which involves a quarterly review with our professional investment manager.

The Treasurer also works with the Board of Stewardship to prepare the annual budget, and to present it to the congregation.

They also participate in Parish Planning Council (PPC) meetings (approx. 5/yr) and Voter's meetings (approx. 3-5/yr), from the perspective of this role and the overall advancing of the congregation's ministry.

Time commitment: 6-8 hours per month on average.

#### **Christian Education and Young People's Ministry**

When we look at Christian Education, we are thinking of all the things we can do to encourage people to be "in the Word", and to study it together at the various stages of our lives. There is a special emphasis on the work we do with our youth, seeking to help them lay a strong foundation of faith for their lives in the church. Our Deaconess is an excellent resource in this work, especially in Family Life ministry, and will continue to be that valuable resource for the elected chairperson.

Areas of responsibility under this board involve Sunday School; VBS; the library; youth ministry; and our various Bible studies. Although much of the work is done through the Church staff (Deaconess and Pastors), the Board of Education plays a key role in bringing it all together, as we seek to provide Christian education and nurture to all of our members. While it can seem like a daunting task, the Director will seek to encourage and involve others in the work of Christian education within the congregation. Again, there are resources and helps for this task, too.

This board member also ensures that our youth program has leadership, is organized and well run, and encourages all youth to be active participants in the congregation.

This position is much more of an oversight position to ensure our Christian education and youth programs are well run and resourced properly.

What does it take to do fill this position? More than anything else, it would be a love for God's Word and a desire to see that spread throughout the congregation in a strong program of Christian education. Is this what God is calling you to do?

Key skills (gifts, talents):

- · A heart for the study of God's Word, and young people.
- · Caring, supportive, encouraging Able to encourage church workers in their duties, and able to encourage congregants in Christian growth.
- 6 Time commitment: 2-4 hours per week on average.

#### **FAMILY TIME IN CHRIST**

In Calgary, gardens are planted the long weekend in May (unless there's a blizzard, when planting might be a bit delayed!) Use your time in the garden to sow some seeds of faith!

As you plant your seeds, consider what a seed needs to become a mature plant: water, sunshine, fertilizer, protection from weeds and pests. Now consider what the seed of faith planted in your child at baptism needs in order for it to grow and mature: time in God's Word at home and at church; remembrance of Baptism as often as possible (Luther's Morning and Evening Prayers encourage this daily); a Christian community; protection from the things of the world that would tear down and destroy faith. Pray that God would grant you the will and the strength to tend those faith-seeds also!

Include your children in planting and caring for your garden. As you work, consider together Matthew 13:3-9 and 18-23. Discuss each of the soils and why seed grows or doesn't. What "cares of the world", or thorns distract us from the things of Christ? How does Satan try to snatch us out of His hand? Now read John 15:1-5. What promise does Jesus make?

As you transfer your bedding plants, taking care not to damage the roots, talk about the importance of good, healthy roots. What do roots do? Where do you want the roots to be planted? Why? Read Ephesians 3:14-19 and Colossians 2:6-7. Where are a Christian's roots attached? What blessings does that give?

God grant that the gardens in your back yards, and especially the gardens in your homes, are fruitful this planting season!
