*CALL UPDATE:* Pastor Pearce and his wife visited Calgary August 29-30. During their visit they spent time with our congregational leaders last Tuesday evening, and enjoyed some social time with our members on Wednesday evening. Pastor Pearce will be considering both his current call and our call to him over the next weeks. Please pray for he and his family, and for his congregation, Bethlehem Lutheran Church, in Adelaide.

**VBS UPDATE:** A total of 70 students from 44 families attended our "God's Promises for Me" Vacation Bible School this year. In addition, three parents attended the Bible study offered daily through the week. We give thanks to God for all of those who shared their time and their gifts in order to plant and nurture seeds of faith as they shared God's Word!



Each day an offering was collected, with half of what was given to help defray VBS costs, and half to be given to Hope Mission for their children's programs. A total of \$547.31 was given by our VBS families.



# MISSION OF THE MONTH THE MUSTARD SEED

The Mustard Seed is a Christian non-profit organization that has been caring for individuals experiencing homelessness and poverty since 1984.

Operating in seven cities across Western Canada, The Mustard Seed is a supportive haven where people can have their physical, mental, and spiritual needs met and grow toward greater health and independence.

Programs and services include: basic needs – emergency shelter, meals, clothing, and hygiene items, health and wellness, housing, employment, spiritual care, community engagement, community impact centres.

Later this month, we will welcome a representative from The Mustard Seed for a short presentation after service, details forthcoming.

A FAMILY WITH A BABY ON THE WAY: One of our families is expecting their first baby in September and there are some necessities like a car seat and crib that are needed. Please prayerfully consider providing a cash gift towards making the purchases of these items possible. You can drop off your gift money to Amber in the church office. There is also a baby card for you to sign if you wish to do so. We hope to purchase these items by the end of August so submitting your gift to Amber by August 17 would be appreciated.

REFUGEE SPONSORSHIP UPDATE: At our January voters' meeting the congregation voted to support the Rahmani family (who attend our church) in bringing over the rest of their family members who are in a region where Christians are being persecuted. This support involves providing backstop funding of \$60,000.00 that can be used by the family to support them during their first year in Canada. If it isn't needed by the family, it is returned to the church after one year. It is a requirement of the government that this funding be in place as part of the application for refugee status. We have been waiting for the government to finalize their refugee numbers and they have finally done that. Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR) will now be applying for four members of the Rahmani family to immigrate to Canada, and Foothills has provided \$62,000.00 to the CLWR trust fund to support the application. The \$62,000.00 will come from approximately \$20,000.00 that our members have contributed to our Refugee Fund and will be topped up by roughly \$42,000.00 from our church savings. Over time, the plan is to replace this \$42,000.00 with member donations to the Refugee Fund. If you want to support the Rahmani family's immigration to Canada, please donate to the Refugee Fund, as over time we would like to replace the \$42,000.00 from church savings.

It will take at least a year and possibly two before they can immigrate to Canada, but praise God that the process has started and please pray for the Rahmani family as they are still in a dangerous area where Christians are being persecuted during this time.
