

PLEASE PRAY: Federal Bill C-9 passed its second reading in committee. If it passes its third reading at the end of January, it will become illegal to teach or read aloud portions of the Bible as they would be considered "hate speech" once the religious exemption for free expression is removed. (e.g. Leviticus, Deuteronomy, and Romans) Please pray that the freedom to share God's word be retained in Canada. Respectfully writing or phoning your MP and elected persons serving on the Justice Committee would also be impactful.

CREATIVE RESPONSE

Jesus calls all his followers to 'fish for people'.

One way we do so is through prayer – by praying for specific people that don't as yet know Jesus, and for specific missionaries and mission activities.

Hang a string or a cord between two points in your home and attach small hooks to it. Cut out fish shapes from card or paper and write the name of a person you can pray for. Attach the 'fish' to the hooks and use your 'fishing line' as a visible reminder to pray.



ACTION RESPONSE

In Psalm 27, we hear King David expressing his heartfelt desire to worship God in the temple all the days of his life (Psalm 27:4) The way we care for our places of worship reflects our appreciation for God and for the gifts he gives us in worship.

Commit as a household to an act of service to improve the state of your church facility e.g. gardening, window cleaning, painting. Make the needed arrangements for this.
